ABOUT TYNDALE

THE HISTORY

Tyndale University College & Seminary was founded in 1894 as the Toronto Bible Training School. Later known as Toronto Bible College, it merged with the London College of Bible and Missions in 1968 to become Ontario Bible College. The Seminary was established in 1976 to offer graduate theological education. In 1998, the name Tyndale was assumed, honouring William Tyndale (1494-1536), the early English reformer who undertook the first English translation of the Bible. He is a model for scholarship, faith, and vision.

In 2003, Tyndale was accorded university college status by the Province of Ontario. In 2007, Tyndale received approval from the Ontario Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities and from the Ontario College of Teachers to offer a Bachelor of Education program.

The Seminary's graduate degrees, including the Doctor of Ministry degree, are accredited by The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS). On April 1, 2013 Tyndale took official possession of a beautiful, 56-acre property on Bayview Avenue, the former home of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Toronto. This is the new, consolidated home of Tyndale University College & Seminary.

Tyndale is an evangelical school with more than 1,600 students representing 40 denominations and 60 ethnic backgrounds and 9,500 alumni.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNA

Eunice Smith, MDiv 1983

Eunice (Veley) Smith was the first female to be awarded the Master of Divinity degree from Tyndale Seminary (formerly Ontario Theological Seminary - OTS).

Born in Belleville, Ontario in 1930, Eunice first experienced a call to mission at the age of twelve. She met her husband Cecil Smith while studying at the Western Canadian Bible Institute in Regina, SK. They married in 1952 and began their 60 years of ministry together. Cecil and Eunice were appointed by the Christian and Missionary Alliance to serve in Ecuador as professors at the Seminario Biblico Alianza in the port city of Guayaquil. In addition to teaching in the seminary, they also served the Quichua people in the mountain cities of Quito and Ambato during their 25 years in Ecuador. Eunice's greatest joy was preparing young people from Ecuador, Peru, Chile, Colombia and the Caribbean for church ministry. In 1983 Cecil and Eunice were re-assigned to church-planting in Mexico City. This time, Eunice taught the fundamentals of the faith to new believers. While in Canada, Eunice and Cecil travelled the country recounting God's work in Latin America.

Taking advantage of every opportunity to learn and serve wherever the Lord placed her, Eunice taught Greek while completing a Master of Missiology at Ambrose University College (then Canadian Bible Seminary). Later, she taught missions while completing her Master of Divinity at Tyndale (OTS) in 1983. Since returning to Canada in 1996, Eunice has taught several Bible courses in Ecuador, Mexico and Cuba. In May 2013, Eunice Smith will be ordained to the Gospel ministry, the first woman to be ordained by the Christian & Missionary Alliance Canada following changes made to the ordination policy in 2012.

Eunice currently lives in Richmond, BC teaching and ministering at Richmond Alliance Church. Cecil passed away in December 2012. The Smiths have three children: Gordon Timothy, Judith Marlene Henry and Benjamin Milton, as well as grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

GRADUATING STUDENT SPEAKER

Stacey Campbell, MDiv 2013

Stacey Campbell was born in Tillsonburg, Ontario. She lived one year abroad in Neuchatel, Switzerland before returning to Canada to pursue a diploma in Business Administration from Humber College. She continued her studies and completed a third level CGA designation. She began working in the marketing industry in the late 1980s and, along with her husband, purchased a direct marketing company where she has worked for over two decades. Because of her many leadership roles in her church community, Stacey felt led to study at Tyndale to be better equipped for ministry. Concurrent with her studies, she worked with Claremont Theological Seminary in San Francisco to co-write a curriculum for Canadian church communities on compassion. The curriculum aims to better prepare volunteers and leaders for outreach ministry. The pilot program is set to launch in September 2013 in Alberta, Manitoba, Ontario, and Nova Scotia.

Stacey currently serves as the National Director of Community and Church Engagement for Prison Fellowship Canada. In this role, she focuses on building partnerships with church communities and national partners in order to serve inmates, ex-offenders, and their families. She believes in and practices a biblical approach to transformation, justice, and prevention. As part of her Master of Divinity work, she formed a Prison Fellowship chapter at a local correctional institution. She currently leads a group of 30 volunteers at Vanier Centre for Women who minister weekly to over 100 inmates through Bible studies, one-to-one spiritual counselling, grief and loss programs, and narrative art therapy. Stacey resides in Caledon, Ontario with her husband John, and their beloved children, Anastasia and John Nicholas.

HONORARY DOCTORATE

Lascelles George Newman, PhD

Lascelles George Newman has been President of the Caribbean Graduate School of Theology (CGST) in Kingston, Jamaica since 2008. A graduate of Ontario Bible College class of 1976 (now Tyndale), the University of Waterloo, and the Oxford Centre for Mission Studies in Oxford, England (where he earned his PhD in Mission History), Dr. Newman has spent over 30 years working in student ministry in the Caribbean and around the world. He served for fifteen years (1979-1994) as General Secretary of the Jamaican Intersarsity Christian Fellowship and Scripture Union (ISCF/SU), ten years (1995-2005) as Regional Secretary for the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students, and subsequent years as Associate General Secretary and Chief Administrative Officer of the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES) in Oxford, England.

His passion for ministry has led him to serve in many other capacities in the Caribbean, including Chair of Open Air Campaigners (JA) Ltd, Organizing Secretary for the National Leadership Prayer Breakfast in Jamaica (1981- 2002), Chair of Langham Partnership Caribbean Regional Council, Chair of the IFES Task Force on Christian Mission and Social Justice, and Adjunct Faculty of the Caribbean Graduate School of Theology where he has delighted in teaching Caribbean Church History, Politics and Culture in the Caribbean, and Church and Community Development. He is currently the Chair of the Council of Trustees of the Oxford Centre for Mission Studies in Oxford, England.

Dr. Newman writes in the area of Mission History and Church and Society. He is married to Canadian-born Margaret Jane DeJong and they have three children, Minke, Anneke, and Johnathan.

Dr. Newman will be teaching an intensive summer course at Tyndale, May 13-17, 2013 entitled "A Global Faith: Lessons from the Global South."
