NINTH ANNUAL




An audience of 1400 witnessed the ninth annual Graduation Exercises of the London Bible Institute in the H. B. Beal Technical School auditorium on the evening of May 23. Dr. J. Wilmot Mahood, the founder of L.B.I., presented the diplomas to seventeen graduates. Six of the graduates also received the Teacher's Diploma of the Evangelical Teacher Training Association. For the first time in the history of the school, 83 undergraduates received certificates from the above mentioned E.T.T.A.

The guest speaker, Dr. Alva J. McClain, President of Grace Theological Seminary, Winona Lake, Indiana, gave a very helpful and Christ honouring message on the text, John 15:16, "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain; that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you."

This service climaxed a busy week of school life and graduation activities. The Baccalaureate Service was held Sunday, May 18, in the Adelaide Street Baptist Church. Rev. John Honeyman, Superintendent of L.B.I., was the speaker.

GRADUATION



The long and fearful period of examinations concluded on Monday and Tuesday. Wednesday the school picnic was scheduled to be held at Springbank Park. The inclement weather, however, turned the picknickers back to the school dining hall, and youthful spirits were not dampened by the rain.

Missionary Day, Thursday, began at 10:00 a.m. in the Central Baptist Church Annex with Rev. John Bell of the C.I.M. as guest speaker. Miss Marion Pittaway (L.B.I. '42), recently returned from the field, brought an interesting report of her work in French Equatorial Africa where she has served her first term under the Sudan United Mission. The morning session was closed with a devotional message by Dr. Mahood. L.B.I. was blessed with the ministry of another warm-hearted friend, Dr. Isaac Page of Toronto, who in the evening brought a practical message concerning student life as related to missions.

The Alumni held their annual banquet at Llyn Lodge that same evening, when the new graduates were welcomed into the alumni family. About 40 attended.

Those who were present at the Friday morning session will not soon forget the exposition of II Peter 1:1-21 given by Dr. McClain, nor the message by Pastor Logsdon which closed the chapel programmes for the school year.

The London Bible Institute was given the deed to the property it now occupies at 518 Queens Avenue at a surprise presentation during the graduation exercises, May 23. Mr. Wm. C. Benson, president of the London Evangelistic Association made the presentation to Mr. R. M. Winslow, chairman of the Board of Directors of the London Bible Institute.

Throughout the life of the school, the London Evangelistic Association has played an important role. In 1938, this Association, which is composed of Christian business men, purchased the property at 517 Queen's Avenue and loaned it to L.B.I. without charge. This means that a home has been provided for the Institute by the L.E.A. since that year. In the fall of 1944, the Association negotiated the purchase of the present home of L.B.I., 518 Queens Avenue, at a purchase price of

\$22,000.00 This property is now debt free because of the faithfulness of our God through the generosity of the many friends of L.B.I. and a sizeable contribution from the L.E.A.

In accepting the deed on behalf of the Board, Mr. Winslow referred to the early history of the Institute and its indebtedness to the London Evangelistic Association for its leadership and financial assistance during the formative years of the Institute. In particular is the school indebted to Mr. Benson who for many years promoted the work of the Institute as chairman of the Board of Directors.

During the twelve years' history of L.B.I. there has been a steady climb in student enrollment. Last year the registrations for day school totaled 171. It is expected that the fall enrollment for the 1947-48 session will reach the 200 mark.

Housing, therefore, is one of the major problems confronting the school. The present building, at 518 Queens Avenue, a spacious and beautiful

home, is already crowded to full capacity and does not provide accommodation for chapel periods and large classes. The basement and first floor are given over to class rooms and offices; the second and third floors provide living quarters for some of the faculty and 42 freshmen girls.

When the present property was first occupied by the Institute in July, 1945, the then garage was converted into an attractive dining hall. Today that dining hall is too small. In order that its capacity may be increased, a new kitchen is now under construction, and the present kitchen will be utilized for additional dining room space.

A chapel with a seating capacity of at least 300 and two large classrooms is a pressing need. During the past year, chapel periods and the large Bible Survey classes

have been meeting in the Annex of the Central Baptist Church. This has been the Lord's provision for meeting the emergency in a most adequate manner. The unstinted co-operation and contribution of this church has been most gratifying.

BUILDING FUND NECESSARY

Those reading this survey will at once visualize the need facing the Institute. The Board of Directors has established a Building Fund designed to meet the need of the expansion programme. Plans are being carefully laid either to purchase more property or to build a chapel on the present property. We are urging the friends of the Institute to make this a matter of special prayer that the Lord may reveal His will and guide those who have the planning to do; those who have the money to invest; and those who will execute the task, that in all things His name may be glorified and His work promoted. All donations for this project should be sent to the London Bible Institute Building Fund. Our confidence is in Him who has promised to supply our every need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus. "Our God is able" and we want to keep pace with His plan for L.B.I.

We shall continue to pray that God's richest blessings may be hers and that in losing her life for His sake, she may find it richer and fuller than ever before.




ALUMNI NEWS
