

I am taking the liberty of quoting a remarkable statement made by Daniel Webster . . . "If truth be not diffused, error will be. # **Announcing 1953 Summer School**

SUMMER SESSION, 1953, will begin on Monday, May 25, and will continue for six weeks. Courses offered this year are beginner's Greek and Hebrew. The amount of work covered in each course will be the same as that covered in winter session. For each of the courses offered, six credits may be earned toward the Diploma or a Degree of the school.
