
First Year Students - 1955 - 56

At L.B.I. we believe that we have special cause for thanksgiving to God as we recognize His favour in again sending us a fine group of new students. Most of them come from Ontario, but Saskatchewan, Quebec, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia; New York, Pennsylvania, and Michigan are also represented in the Freshman class.

There are over sixty students in the three first-year classes—the Bible Institute class, the Introductory Year for those without Grade XIII who desire to take a degree course, and the Bible College class. Three other new students have enrolled for post-graduate work toward a degree—one a graduate of Briercrest Bible Institute, one a graduate of Moody, and the third a 1948 graduate of our own Institute.

The theme of this year's orientation program was "Our God whom we serve is able . . . ", and it is with this confidence that students and faculty look to Him daily, knowing that the Lord is our sufficiency during days of training and service until He comes again.

Plan now to attend every session. Pertinent details will be announced in our next Bulletin.


Announcing **New Appointments**

In the ministry of the gospel what is it that God has promised to bless? It is stock language among ministers and laymen that often preachers announce a text and then immediately depart therefrom. Last summer I heard a preacher who is noted for announcing his text, relating several illustrations, and then giving the invitation. With this kind of thing going on, it is no wonder that so many people these days are ignorant of the Scriptures and the church receives so little of the blessing of God.

What is it that God has promised to bless? The Prophet Isaiah answers: "For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: so shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it." (Isaiah 55:10, 11.) Add to this passage the searching question of the Lord through the Prophet Jeremiah: "Is not my word like as a fire? saith the Lord; and like a hammer that breaketh the rock in pieces?" (Jer. 23:29.)

The New Testament places the emphasis upon the same truth. We are told that "the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Heb. 4:12); that men are born again "by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever" (I Pet. 1:23); that "the holy scriptures . . . are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Jesus Christ" (II Tim. 3:15); that "faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17).

In the matter of Christian living our Lord prayed in the garden, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth" (John 17:17). To put it another way, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby" (I Pet. 2:2). The Apostle Paul, after having been in the ministry for many years, penned the following as part of the final message to Timothy: "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." (II Tim. 3:16, 17.)

What has God promised to bless? The answer of Scripture is unmistakable: God has promised to bless **His Word**. In every realm of Christian experience salvation, sanctification, service—the Spirit of God uses the Word of God.

In these days when the great cry is for revival, how can we expect such blessing unless we do God's work in God's way? Pastors, teachers, missionaries, parents, let us be Biblicists; let us herald forth that which God has promised to bless—His own eternal Word!

To such, the London Bible Institute and Theological Seminary is committed.
