
L. B. I. Students Are NOW Serving Christ!

Kneel and pray beside a busy sidewalk at 4:30 in the afternoon? That is what two men were doing in London, Ontario, one day this past autumn. One was an L.B.I. student, the other a broken-hearted man. It all began when the man asked for help as they sat at a bus stop. The Bible was opened, a sympathetic conversation followed, and Jesus Christ was presented as the answer to this man's need. Then, rather strangely perhaps, the young witness asked if the new convert would kneel with him on the damp pavement and give his heart to Christ in prayer. He gladly responded, seemingly oblivious of the passing crowds, and another soul was born into the Kingdom of God! Recent follow-up has shown the fruits of faith in the man's life. He is now reconciled to his wife, and "things are different now".

While this experience is more dramatic than most, L.B.I. students reported a total of **60 professions of faith in Christ** as a result of their ministries in the first three months of this school year. May this encourage us all to be ambassadors for Christ wherever we are. Our students are not waiting until the end of their training; **THEY ARE NOW SERVING CHRIST!**

Dr. Macaulay

Dr. J. C. Macaulay will deliver a special series of Bible lectures at the London Bible Institute and Theological Seminary, February 3-7, 1958.

Although born in Belfast, Ireland, Dr. Macaulay was brought up in Scotland and his speech is marked still by the burr of the land of the heather.

Dr. Macaulay was educated at Glasgow University and Wheaton College, Wheaton, Illinois. In January, 1949, Wheaton College conferred upon him the honorary doctor of divinity degree.

This Scottish gentleman with the twinkling blue eyes served pastorates in various parts of Canada and the United States before he became pastor of Wheaton Bible Church, where he served for almost 13 years. During that time he also taught some Bible classes in Wheaton College. He joined the faculty at Moody Bible Institute in 1951.

Dr. Macaulay has written several devotional commentaries on books of the New Testament. His latest work is a textbook on personal evangelism written in collaboration with Dr. Robert Belton of the Institute Faculty. He writes the leading lesson article in the **Sunday School Times** every week, and contributes to **Moody Monthly**, a magazine of some 100,000 circulation, and to other Christian publications.



The program included a chapel period, missionary film, coffee time, family breakfast and devotions, faculty forum, Chinese dinner, business meeting, Sunday hymn-sing and five precious messages from Rev. George McAlpine, pastor of Oakwood Baptist Church, Toronto.

In his Saturday evening's meditation, Mr. McAlpine pointed out that the same hands of Christ, once used in the breaking of bread, and again later nailed to the Cross on our behalf, are now repairing, constructing and beautifying His Church.


At the conclusion of the Sunday afternoon service, we left with a burning desire that Christ might have such control over every area of our lives that in days to come we might "walk worthy . . ."


