

A Note from the President's Desk

How would you like to be a choir director? Not the director of an ordinary choir, but of one, some of whose members read **Chinese and no English**, and others of whom read **English and no Chinese!** In addition, your choir sings in a church with open windows and doors, just three feet from a street down which there is a constant stream of careening cars and vendors of a variety of questionable eatables, lustily bawling out their wares. Occasionally during the church service, curious passersby stick their heads in the windows of your church and pause to comment, or wave frantically at you and choir as you sing.

The roar of cooling fans overhead also make their contribution to the general pandemonium. Of course, only by singing "double forte" can such a choir be heard!

The above is no imaginary situation, but one in which one of our graduates labours in **Singapore**, **Malaya**. The young man concerned left Canada just recently under the China Inland Mission, and, upon arrival, found himself loaned by the mission to a church as choir director. As a result, his musical training at L.B.I. was put to use immediately. He writes, "It seems that **none of our homeside undertakings are being wasted**: our music, art work, dramatic efforts and Chinese studies have all proven a real asset to our work—a real indication that the Lord does prepare us in things we never consider as preparatory."

Experiences like this are being multiplied again and again in the lives of L.B.I. graduates. How gratifying it is to know that **the Lord is preparing young people in our classrooms and on our campus** for His service around the world. Each year the Student Missions Fellowship adopts a budget, and includes in that budget a special project. This year the \$2,000-budget included a \$1,500 airplane hangar to be erected for the Missionary Aviation Fellowship in Brazil. For some months givings fell behind, but as students continued to pray the funds came in and somewhere in the jungles of Brazil there will be erected a building in memory of the consecrated missionary interest of L.B.I. students! S.M.F. also gave \$100 to L.B.I. to purchase a much-needed tape recorder. L.B.I. maintains a strong missionary interest, and a large proportion of our graduates are serving on various mission fields.
