Winter Conference Highlights Paul's Journeys

Philippi, Ephesus, Corinth, Athens—these names are packed with meaning for the Christian. Such places in the Apostle Paul's travels will come alive in our Winter Conference, February 9-13. Each evening at 8:00 Dr. Charles C. Ryrie, President of Philadelphia College of Bible, will illustrate messages on Paul's Journeys with excellent coloured slides. In his three trips to the Holy Land, Dr. Ryrie has traced the footsteps of the Apostle.

Every morning at 11:00 Dr. Ryrie will discuss Biblical Theology. He formerly taught this subject at Dallas Theological Seminary, where he had been the youngest man ever to earn their Doctor of Theology degree. His Doctor of Philosophy degree was received at Edinburgh University.

Dr. Ryrie is the author of *The Place of Women in the Church*, *Neo-Orthodoxy*, and *The Basis of Premillennial Faith*.

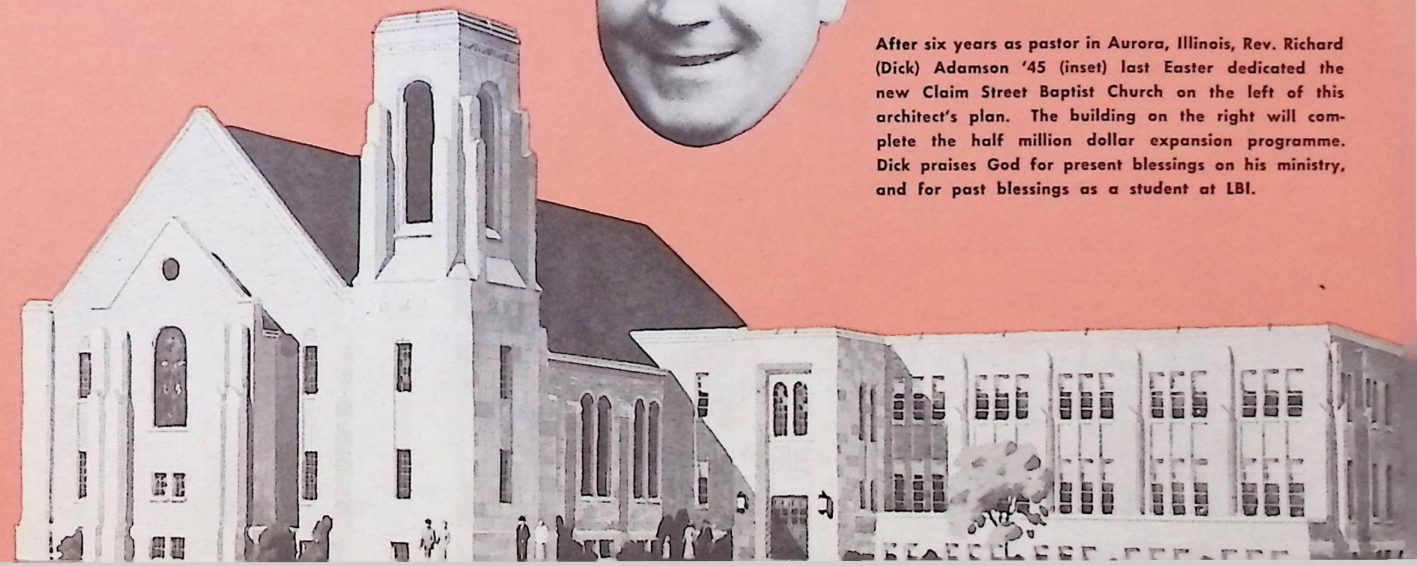
tendance and membership, and moved His people to give.
