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
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LCBM GRADS HOLDING FORTH THE WORD OF LIFE

ACTING PRESIDENT REPORTS

- Almost 1,200 alumni of London College might be pictured on the front cover of our News this month. In 44 countries of the world Alumni are holding forth the Word of Life. The impact of these servants of God emphasizes the basic purpose of our College to prepare young people for "World Evangelization through Trained Leadership."
- Applications are being received weekly from Christian young people who are seeking training at London College. Applications should be submitted as early as possible since the processing of applications takes some time to complete. Will you pray with us that we might have 100 applications in this Centennial year?
- William J. Carey has been appointed to the Board of Governors of London College. Most of our Alumni will remember him as the son of the former Director of Music at London College. Bill is the vice-principal of an elementary school in London.
- The girls in Dixon Hall are enjoying new chesterfields in the lounge donated by the members of the Women's Auxiliary. The Women's Auxiliary meet together once a month to pray for the College, to work in practical ways to assist in the work, and to give towards a special project for the College. All of us greatly appreciate their concern and interest.
- We face a considerable challenge in the next months of completing our donation goal of \$84,000. About \$38,000. has been received so far. We need an additional \$46,000. by May 31. This amount is urgently needed to complete the training of our 145 students. We are trusting God to provide for this important ministry through His people.

PARENTS' WEEKEND

On the weekend of December 10th and 11th, 81 parents visited campus. Mr. Furtney, parent-host of the weekend reported "The group of parents who came were very enthusiastic, very friendly, and it made for a most pleasant time of fellowship. We had a tour of the College Campus, saw where our sons and daughters live and work (the quarters were spotless). We saw a lively basketball game against Detroit Bible College (we lost, but by a narrow margin). London College, however, won the volleyball game. On Sunday, of course, the College Choir put on their annual Musicale at H. B. Beal Secondary School auditorium before approximately 1,200 people, the largest attendance we have ever had. This program which climaxed the entire weekend was well arranged and effectively staged."

NEW SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

Unique scholarships have been made available by the Governors of London College. Students entering London College of Bible and Missions with an average of 75 percent or above in four subjects (seven credits), and meeting the general admission requirements, will be awarded free tuition for the first semester, and all successive semesters as long as a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 is maintained. The maximum time that a student may be eligible for the scholarship is the normal length of the degree program in which he or she is enrolled.

These scholarships will be called Governors' Scholarships, and a limited number will be available each year. Those who are interested in such scholarships must complete Admission papers and the Scholarship application form before August 15. Announcement will be made concerning the awarding of Scholarships as soon as Grade XIII departmental examination results are available.

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Choosing Life's Vocation...

Today's youth are confronted with a vast number of attractive vocational opportunities. The choice of life's vocation is made difficult because of the imposing array of promising fields of employment. Salary scale, opportunity for advancement, security, working environment, and personal interests and aptitudes are usually taken into consideration in making this important decision.

CONSIDERING GOD'S VOCATIONAL CHOICE

But these criteria are not sufficient for the Christian young person. He must ask the more searching question, "What is God's vocational choice for me?"

Some seem to have the misconception that God's plan for a life only applies to those who are going to be pastors, missionaries, or Christian education directors. People not called to one of these Christian professions are free to pick and choose their own life's work for themselves. This unscriptural view fails to realize that all types of employment must be done "unto the Lord" because we "serve the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:23, 24). The Lordship of Christ is as much involved in secular as sacred employment.

CONSIDERING CHURCH VOCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

In seeking God's choice of a life profession, the Christian young person should not overlook the challenging fields of Christian ministry. Unfortunately, many are so captured by the attractive secular openings that they never seriously face up to the possibility of church related vocations.

No higher honour can befall any young person than to be chosen by God for some Christian ministry. The apostle Paul was so impressed with the privilege of serving Christ in this special capacity that he called it a "treasure", an opportunity of inestimable value (II Corinthians 4:1 and 7). Elsewhere Paul indicates that those who seek the office of a bishop, "desires a good thing" (I Timothy 3:1). Ambition to serve God in a church related vocation is admirable and commendable.

Christian service is challenging, demanding, and gratifying. The commission of the church is to present the good news about lesus to every man in each generation. At no time in the history of the church has the opportunity and obligation been greater than in these days of population explosion. Today, choice servants of God who studied at London College of Bible and Missions are strategically located throughout the world. Their great satisfaction is in knowing that their ministries are making a positive and lasting contribution in the unfolding drama of God's eternal purpose. Countless numbers more are needed to fill the many openings that exist.

CONSIDERING LIFE'S INVESTMENT POTENTIAL

As today's youth face the decision of what their life's vocation will be, they should carefully consider the possibility of full time Christian service. Many people are content to be human parasites, sponging off society, taking all they can get, while doing nothing more than is absolutely necessary. The need today is for Christian young people who are determined that their life will have made a difference.

This life should be an investment for the future. Jesus said, "Lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven where neither moth nor rust do corrupt" (Matthew 6:20). Youth should make sure that their choice of vocation will produce the most permanent dividends.
