YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED CONCERNING LONDON COLLEGE

1. What Course Should I Take?

London offers courses with majors in Pastoral Studies, Pre-Seminary Studies, Missions, Christian Education, and Music. These studies lead to a B.Th., B.R.E., or B.S.M. degree. Your choice of program depends upon your future ministry and course in high school. A three-year diploma program and one-year special program are also offered.

2. What Are The Requirements For Admission?

A 60% average in Grade 12 or 13 is the basic requirement for all courses. There are special entrance tests for Adult students or those with below 60%. Write to the Registrar for details.

3. If I Study at London College Will My Education be Accredited?

London College is a member of the Accrediting Association of Bible Colleges and as such it provides many fine advantages to its graduates.

4. What Will It Cost Me to Study For a Year at London College?

Approximately \$1,000.00 — Tuition, \$320; Books, \$60-\$100; Room & Board, \$550; Incidentals, \$25 = \$995.00.

5. Will I Receive Any Financial Aid?

Bursaries, scholarships and loan funds are offered by the College.

6. Will the College Help Me Find a Part-Time lob?

The College maintains an employment service for its students. The local community supplies our students with many job opportunities on a part-time basis.

7. While I Am at London Will I be Able to Serve the Lord?

Various outlets for ministry are provided in the form of mission work, hospital work, youth work, College choir and gospel teams, and ministry in local churches.

8. How Will I Develop Leadership Ability?

Several student organizations afford opportunities for students to develop leadership: Student Council, Student Missionary Fellowship, The College Choir, College Year Book, and the College Newspaper. Our sports activities consist of hockey, volleyball and basketball.

9. How Do I Apply?

By writing to the Registrar, Box 65, London, Ont., and requesting an application form.

10. When Will I Hear About the Action Taken On My Application?

As soon as your application papers are complete and the Admissions Committee has arrived at a decision.
