### The School God Gave Us

Classes in Bible study were begun in the fall of 1935 by Dr. J. Wilmot Mahood in the London Gospel Tabernacle. Because of the enthusiastic response a further step forward was taken — day classes were begun. Interest grew during the ensuing two years so that day school attendance was doubled. By 1938 the Lord enabled the purchase of a school building at 517 Queen's Ave. The school became a chartered institution in the same year.

During the following years Dr. Mahood and Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Hartill were assisted by qualified, voluntary teachers. By 1942 classroom accommodation was at a premium and began to present a new challenge.

#### THE SCHOOL . . . .

When Mr. Hartill accepted a call, in 1943, to teach at Northwestern Bible School, Mr. and Mrs. Hartill resigned from the faculty. Not long afterward, the founder, Dr. Mahood, also resigned.

February 1, 1945, found our new president, Rev. James N. Bedford, ready to assume his duties at L. B. I. During the summer of 1945 the school moved into its new home at 518 Queen's Ave. The hand of God has been manifested in the securing of such an admirable site and such a splendid building for a mere fraction of its original cost.

### Dedication Service


FRIDAY, September 21st, witnessed the formal dedication of the new home of the London Bible Institute. The service was held at Central Baptist Church in order to accommodate an audience far beyond the capacity of our school chapel. There was cause for real rejoicing as the building was "dedicated to a positive evangelical ministry".

President James N. Bedford gave a short history of the school, its expansion and the manner in which the new building was acquired. The "New Voice with the Old Message" proved to be Dr. E. Ralph Hooper, veteran missionary and medical doctor, now Dean of the Institute. He expressed joy at being affiliated with the school and gratitude to the Lord for leading him to this new field of endeavour.

Mr. Rowland Hill, Jr., Chairman of the Board of Directors, presented "The Miracle of the New Building," revealing to us God's provision for our need of new facilities. Praise ascended from the hearts of all present to the One who has given to us exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think.


Dr. Oswald J. Smith, pastor of the People's Church, Toronto, delivered the message of the evening. Students and friends of the school were moved by his statement that there are over one thousand tribes who have never heard the story of redeeming grace and who have no portion of the Word of God in their own language. Even more forceful were the words, "What right has any man to hear the Gospel twice before all have heard it once?" An acceptable response was registered as lives were dedicated to the evangelization of the unreached masses.

### Our President's Message

AST words ought to be memorable words. Thus, at the conclusion of this period of life's experience and the commencement of a new chapter, I should like to leave with you some memorable words of Paul the Apostle as given to the Philippians. I would that the Spirit of God might engrave them upon your minds and write them upon your hearts.

"Not that I have already obtained, or am already made perfect; but I press on if so be that I may lay hold on that for which also I was laid hold on by Christ Jesus."

-Phil. 3:12 (American Standard Revision)

This testimony was given at the height of Paul's illustrious career. It is at once retrospective and prospective. He recalls the day of his conversion as well as the purpose of his consecration. It encompasses his turning to God and his desire to triumph with God. Such a "turning" was evidence that Another had laid hold upon him. A man of his disposition would not have turned himself. It was the grip of God upon His life. At once his career of systematic persecution yielded to a career of sound preaching. He had no doubt that Jesus Christ had laid hold upon him.


The certainty of your salvation is the pledge of your future service. The movements of our Lord are always purposeful. Redemption was not secured merely for your personal satisfaction. You are saved to serve, redeemed to reach out for others, and won to Christ that you may witness a good confession. The road before you lies straight ahead. It must not wind backward to idleness.

At the moment our Lord "laid hold" upon Paul, he discovered that it was for a purpose. His question was, "Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do?" and the reply came, "Arise and go into the city and it shall be told thee what thou must do." His divine orders were explicit and he faithfully sought to complete his task. There was a holy dissatisfaction beating in his breast. He was not content for he had not yet attained as he said, "Not that I have already obtained or am already made perfect." The road still led on; his schooling was never over. Though trained as few others have ever been trained, he could not feel that he had "graduated". How needful that we remind ourselves of these matters.

This insatiable thirst led him forth to the far reaches of the then civilized world. His goal was to "preach the Gospel, not where Christ was named, lest he should build upon another man's foundation." (Rom. 15:2.) He never stopped. There was no soft life of ease for him, no permanent pastorate with old age pension awaiting him, no quiet parsonage where he could "settle down", and no abiding contentment over a task partly accomplished. "I press on."

Your schooling at L. B. I. is not the end. The goal is still ahead and it will require your best to "press on" and to lay hold upon God's objective for your life. It was Dr. Hinson who often said, "Oh, the tragedy of a saved soul but a lost life." To fail to find God's place in service or to be content at partial attainment of one's task is to perpetuate the sad fulfillment of that statement.

But we have learned better things of you. Prayerfully we shall follow you and thus "commend you to God and to the Word of His grace".

While society was groping in readjustment and business was probing for solidity under the lifting depression clouds, God's man of vision was already building on that "Sure Foundation". 





Whether graduation means a return to secular work or the beginning of specialized Christian service, it is our prayer that you may always be found in the will of God, and as you seek to live out His will for you, that you may "Grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ."

### Our Statement of Faith

N these days of lowered standards and, so often, weakening faith, it is the purpose of the London Bible Institute to stand firmly as a school committed to the teaching of the whole Word of God, and it is our purpose that it shall continue to be so.

To accomplish this, in addition to having a clear-cut statement of faith, it is required of each teacher, each school year, before the first lecture is given, to give proof of his or her acceptance of this statement of faith by signing a pledge to that effect.

The following is the statement of faith used by the London Bible Institute:

- 1. We believe in the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments as verbally inspired by God, and inerrant in the original writings, and that they are of supreme and final authority in faith and life.
- 2. We believe in one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- 3. We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten by the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary and is true God and true Man.
- 4. We believe that man was created in the image of God; that he sinned, and thereby incurred, not only physical death, but also that Spiritual death which is separation from God; and that all human beings are born with a sinful nature, and in the case of those who reach moral responsibility become sinners in thought, word and deed.
- We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, as a representative and substitutionary sacrifice; and that all that believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.
- We believe in the resurrection of the crucified body of our Lord, in His
  ascension into Heaven, and in His present life there for us, as High Priest
  and Advocate.
- 7. We believe in "that blessed hope," the personal, premillenial and imminent return of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.
- 8. We believe that all who receive by faith the Lord Jesus Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit and thereby become children of God.
- We believe in the bodily resurrection of the just and unjust, the everlasting blessedness of the saved, and the everlasting, conscious punishment of the lost.

## Service Men's Page

UR hearts are full of praise to God for bringing to us many recruits for the Lord's service. Through testing experiences, they have already received their basic training in trusting God. Days at L.B.I. provide additional opportunities for them to prove the all-sufficiency of their great Captain.



To some, readjustment to school life has been a problem. We praise God that these men are finding their stride again and that, through the aid of the Department of Veterans Affairs' educational grant, they will be ready for re-establishment in civilian life as ministers of the Gospel upon the completion of their course. Two young ladies who have been discharged from the Services are also attending school with the help of this grant.

Last year, on the Bulletin Board in the building across the road, a little notice reminded us to pray for four boys whose courses at school had been interrupted by the war. We prayed and God answered. They are all with us again this year!

We trust that you will rejoice with us as you read a few statements from the lips of ex-Service men now preparing for the service of the King of Kings. Already the impact of their radiant testimonies has been felt at L. B. I.:

It is still true today that, while character grows in the hush of solitude, talent must develop in the busy throng.

We are praying that from L. B. I. an increasing number of consecrated young people, thoroughly furnished unto every good work, may go forth with the gospel into the vast fields which are "white already to harvest". Our lives are hid with Christ in God and daily we are being prepared by precept and practice for the day when He shall live through us in all corners of the earth.

### Student Foreign Missions Fellowship

S. F.M.F. is an association of students, who are looking forward to foreign missionary service, formed to promote missionary fellowship, knowledge of the world field, and prayer for missions. The movement was organized in 1936 when a group of about 100 students, moved by the decreasing number of labourers going to the foreign field, discussed this appalling fact in student conferences in North Carolina and New Jersey. In 1938 a constitution was adopted and headquarters were set up at Wheaton, Ill. The S.F.M.F. has spread until today it is represented in practically every Bible School and Seminary throughout the United States and Canada. Recently, the Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship and the S.F.M.F. have merged together, thus making it possible for the missionary challenge to be presented to university students.

No young person can graduate from L. B. I. without becoming missionary-minded. The committee keeps us constantly reminded of the need on the foreign field. A large sign, on which is written the startling motto given above, confronts us each morning in the first floor foyer. Realizing that there can be "no inspiration without information," missionary literature is placed in a prominent place in the Library. Special news items and revealing statistics are placed on the Bulletin Board in the section devoted to Missions. Each week we are privileged to listen to some speaker fresh from the field and our vision for service is broadened and strengthened. Noon prayer meetings for the different countries stress our intercessory privileges.

Our prayer at L.B.I. is that the Lord will be pleased to call "one out of every two" of our students to take the Gospel to foreign countries. Will you join us in this prayer?

### Is It Nothing To You

. . . that Jesus said, "As My Father hath sent Me, even so send I you?" The disciples, who first heard this command, interpreted it literally in their lives. Does this message carry less weight today? The reason for their self-sacrificing obedience was that their thoughts were centred on the One whose brow had been scarred and whose hands had been pierced for them. Thoughts of Him impelled them to do His bidding. When Paul saw the Lord on the Damascus road, his immediate question was, "Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do?" Christians today need to get a fresh glimpse of the Lord to make them wake up to the claims of Christ on their lives. Pity for the condition of the heathen is not sufficient; love for Christ is the only motivating power which will stand the tests and the discouragements of missionary life.

The saving message of "Life through His Name" has yet to be taken to the 144 million in Europe, 70 million in Africa, 40 million in Japan, 35 million in Central Asia, 60 million in Latin America, 200 million in India and 27 million in the islands of the world. The labourers are few. In many fields there is only one missionary per million souls. A sentence which should strike home to the hearts of all believers is found in 11 Cor. 4:3, "If our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost." It is not the will of the Lord Jesus that any should perish. He cares; is it nothing to you?

When Christ returns, may we be found "redeeming the time for the days are evil." Till then, the command is "GO".

Hear your commission, O Church of the Master; Friends and disciples of Jesus, take heed. How are ye doing the work of the Father? How are ye caring for hunger and need?

Go to the sheep that are scattered and fainting, Having no shepherds, and tell them to come; Go to the highways and tell every creature Still the feast waiteth and yet there is room.

Go, the time shortens, the night is approaching, Harvests are whitening and reapers are few. Somewhere, perhaps, in the darkness are dying Souls that might enter the kingdom with you.

Go, Church of Christ, for He goeth before you,
And all the way that ye take He doth know.

On the bright morrow He'll say, "Come, ye blessed";
But till the dawning the message is "GO"!

### These Arrange Our Socials




