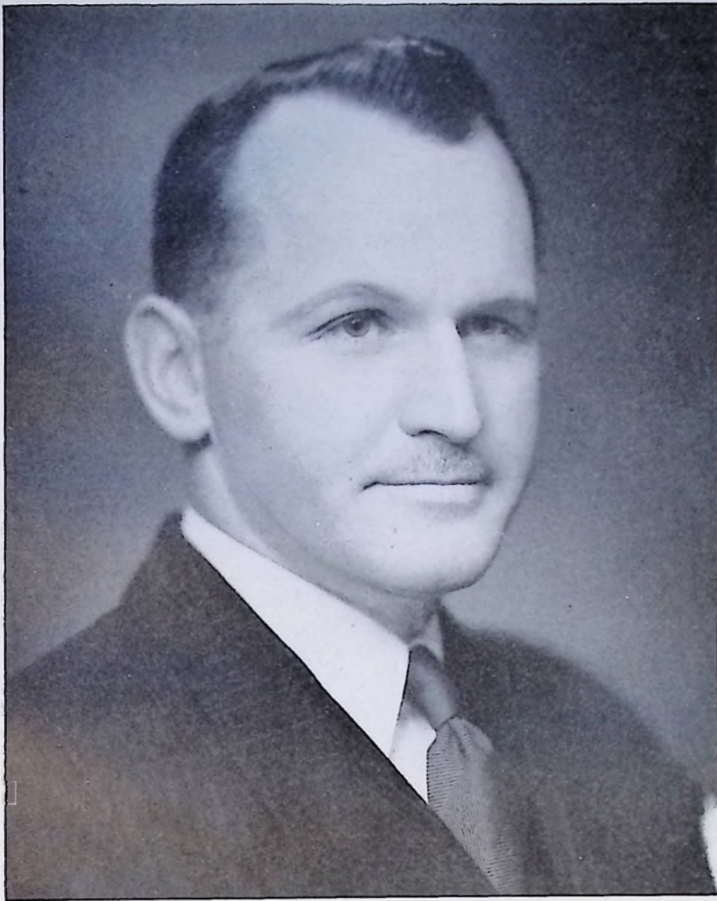
Concurrently with the matters relating to the academic field are the vital responsibilities of administering the financial affairs and properties of the Institute.

The current conditions of instability and unusual financial crises demand exceptional wisdom and foresight, that correct steps may be taken to encourage, rather than hinder, the rapid growth of the school. In spite of prevailing difficulties, adequate facilities must be supplied in such a way that future development may not be curtailed.

In His gracious provision for the well-being of the Institute, God has raised up men of recognized standing and executive ability for this work.

statement of faith

1. We believe in the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments as verbally inspired by God, and inerrant in the original writings, and that they are of supreme and final authority in faith and life.
2. We believe in one God, eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
3. We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten by the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary and is true God and true man.
4. We believe that man was created in the image of God; that he sinned, and thereby incurred, not only physical death, but also that Spiritual death which is separation from God; and that all human beings are born with a sinful nature, and in the case of those who reach moral responsibility become sinners in thought, word and deed.
5. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, as a representative and substitutionary sacrifice; and that all that believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.
6. We believe in the resurrection of the crucified body of our Lord, in His ascension into Heaven, and in His present life there for us, as High Priest and Advocate.
7. We believe in "that blessed hope," the personal, premillennial and imminent return of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.
8. We believe that all who receive by Faith the Lord Jesus Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit and thereby become children of God.
9. We believe in the bodily resurrection of the just and unjust, the everlasting blessedness of the saved, and the everlasting, conscious punishment of the lost.



President

James N. Bedford, B.A., B.D.

President Bedford epitomizes the spirit of the London Bible Institute. His attainment to such a rank of responsibility is due to his abilities and capacity for strenuous endeavour. Scholastically, he is qualified with the Pastor's Course of the Moody Bible Institute, his B.A. from Houghton College, and his B.D. from the Eastern Theological Seminary. For several years he was a pastor, and before coming to the Institute in 1944, he directed "Ship Ahoy", a large Service Center in the Eastern States for the purpose of winning sailors to Jesus Christ during World War II.

Possessing wit and a friendly disposition, his office is always open for counsel; nevertheless, he maintains the high spiritual and scholastic standards of the Institute. Whether in the classroom, chapel, office or pulpit, President Bedford has demonstrated his abilities and won the respect of the faculty and student body.

The London Bible Institute

For the printing of a new book there should be an adequate reason, and for the conducting of a school there should likewise be an adequate cause. Perhaps you have well asked, "What is L.B.I. all about anyway"? It is with this in mind that we offer a few suggestions. In this complex world with its increasing demands, a school of this nature must indeed be able to give a "reason for the hope that is within it".

L.B.I. is primarily designed to be a school of basic training in the Word of God. It aims therefore, to equip the student with a practical knowledge of the Word as a foundation upon which to build in life. Foundations must be carefully laid, for the strength and serviceability of the superstructure depends upon them. Of one thing we are positive: there is no other foundation for life than that which is established in the Scriptures. To build here is to build upon the Rock which secures the house from collapsing when the storms of skepticism, humanism, and despair sweep down upon it. Education without Christ cannot long endure; but alas, how many there are who would attempt to defy this eternal principle. Thus it is that L.B.I., as but one of that large number of Bible institutes and Bible colleges, seeks to meet the need in formulating life's purposes and pursuits upon the authority of the eternal Word.

From her halls have gone forth missionaries, carrying the message of redemption to the perishing millions of Africa, India, China, South America, the far north in the North West Territories, the lumber camps of Northern Ontario, the island world of the Caribbean and war-stricken and confused areas of Europe. This indeed is L.B.I.'s "excuse for existence". To prepare these ambassadors of Christ for this diplomatic service abroad, representing the Court of Grace, is no light responsibility. "Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest that He will thrust forth labourers into His harvest."

Someone has said, that, "When an adult is won, a soul is saved, but when a child is won, a whole life is saved." Much might be said regarding the existence of a special department for Christian Education,

Suffice it to say that it makes the Christian faith the keystone of the educational arch with its specific endeavour in training young hearts for God's glad service. This service, particularized, includes the important responsibility of winning children to a saving knowledge of the living Saviour in ways and means that follow God's laws of nature. It also endeavours to prepare a leadership that will be ready to step into positions of responsibility such as: missionaries, home and abroad; pastor's wives; Bible teachers; children's workers and directors of Christian education in the local churches. L.B.I. has such a department with forty-two enrolled. "Christ in you, the hope of glory . . . we proclaim, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we present every man mature in Christ."

The Gospel ministry demands the best possible preparation. Not all servants of the Cross are privileged to spend four years at a university and then an additional three years at a seminary or theological college before entering upon that which is called, "the active ministry". When such preparation is possible, it indeed seems ideal, but there is a very worthy army of those less privileged academically. These men, who being truly "laid hold upon" by the Lord, and limited to a short period of preparation, must be assisted in their high and holy calling. The Pastor's Course is designed to compress the essentials of the ministry into the narrow confines of three years. It is directional to the student, charting for him methods of study, introducing to him the tools of sermon construction, and most of all, it is a cultivation of His own soul. A survey of the evangelical ministry in almost any geographical location will testify to the inspiration and blessing of the Bible institute and Bible college instruction.

L.B.I. thus dedicated to "positive evangelical teaching ministry" desires sincerely to "make full proof of that ministry". The measure of the Lord's blessing thus far enjoyed is most gratifying, but we would be reminded of the fact that the goal is still ahead. "Let us therefore run for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."



Jean C. Scott, B.A., Registrar

Miss Scott cares for the many duties associated with the office of Registrar. Supervising the business matters relating to a student body of two hundred is a sizeable task. John Honeyman, B.A.

A graduate of the University of Western Ontario and Knox College, Toronto, Mr. Honeyman is the Superintendent of the Institute. In addition, upon him devolves the responsibility of directing the Preparatory year, and that of instructing in Greek and Christian Evidences. His instruction leads the men of the Pastor's Course into the more profound truths of the Greek New Testament and he has contributed greatly toward our students' ability to refute effectively many of the erroneous philosophical ideologies prevalent today.

Summertime is camp time. The students who worked among the children in Bible camps had the unusual opportunity of reaching boys and girls from distant points of our land in their most impressionable years.

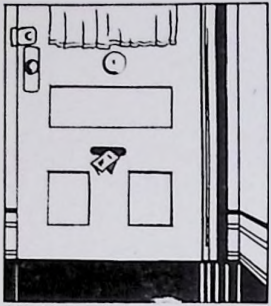

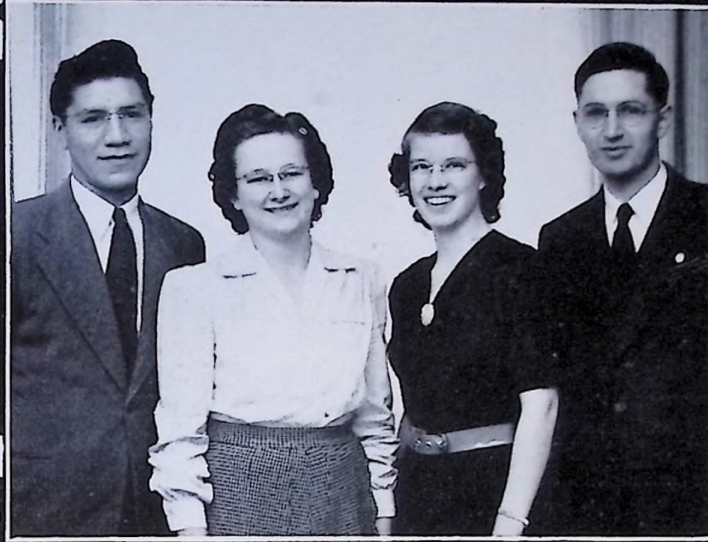
