THAN GREAT RICHES"







### History




"Behind the doors also and the posts hast thou set up thy remembrance."

In 1935 Dr. J. W. Mahood answered the call of God and came to London to found the London Bible Institute. Dr. Mahood, for many years field representative of Moody Bible Institute, had retired to a Californian pastorate but readily relinquished this to do what he believed was a divinely designated task.

In a few weeks, bi-weekly night classes were started in the London Gospel Tabernacle and in 1938 the building at 517 Queens Avenue was purchased, day classes were organized, and the school became a chartered Institute.



In 1944, at the age of 81, Dr. Mahood resigned the presidency of the school and Rev. James N. Bedford succeeded him on Feb. 1, 1945. During that summer, because of the increased enrolment of students, the school moved to its new larger home at 518 Queens Avenue. In September, 1947, a dedicatory service was held and the school building was given the official name of Mahood Hall in honour of our beloved founder.



### STATEMENT OF FAITH


### PRESIDENT JAMES N. BEDFORD, B.A., B.D.
