
Called to Serve

DINING HALL




MUSIC DIRECTOR




THE CHORALE



Campfire devotions climaxed the day. Hymns, festimonies, and a spoken word by Mr. Howard Lundy around our theme concluded the happy day.



Student Missions Fellowship



The Student Missions Fellowship is an organization made up of the entire student body. It is headed by an executive elected by the student body. The Fellowship has a threefold purpose: 1. to encourage student interest in missions, both at home and abroad; 2. to support missions in prayer, especially those missionaries who are our own graduates; 3. to support missionary activity financially by a unified budget of student giving. For the year 1953-54 the goal for missionary giving is set at \$1,800.00.

The '52-'53 objective of \$1,500 was reached, enabling us to present \$700 to Wycliff Translators, and gifts to Miss Lavery and Miss Vincent, missionaries leaving for Africa.
