


The London Bible Institute and Theological Seminary will ever be grateful to God for the three years Dr. Alden A. Gannett was president of the school. He came to London in the fall of 1954 from Dallas, Texas, where he was a pastor and a teacher in the Dallas Theological Seminary. In 1957 he was led of God to return to this Seminary where he accepted the position of professor of English Bible and Theology.

During his time here, Dr. Gannett received his Doctor's degree. The school also saw much progress by the grace of God. L.B.I. received associate membership in the Accrediting Association of Bible Institutes and Bible Colleges; a college-level program was introduced; at the same time the desire for a high spiritual standard was maintained; the Stewardship Fellowship Plan for giving to the Lord's work at L.B.I. was enlarged; for the first time a men's dormitory was provided.

Because of his gifts for teaching, preaching and administration, Dr. Gannett's life was a rich blessing in every realm of school life. He was greatly loved by faculty and students alike. His life showed forth a daily walk in the Spirit. His joy in the Lord was real and his testimony consistent. Dr. Gannett's faithfulness in "preaching the Word" made him to be in much demand as a speaker both in Canada and the United States. It was his desire not only to preach the Word but to live by the Word. He was an example of what God can do with a life yielded to Him.

Mrs. Gannett and their four children, Keith, Ronald, Mary Lynn and Stevie also won a real place in our hearts. Yes, we thank God for the Gannetts!


At the conclusion of the Sunday afternoon service, we left with a burning desire that Christ might have such control over every area of our lives that in days to come we might "walk worthy. . . "










CHRISTMAS CONCERT

The number in the class presenting the play was small but the Lord was truly with them through it all. Because we felt His presence



SPRING PICNIC




Future pastors, teachers, missionaries, nurses, Christian Education directors and business men were urged to be faithful in the special task which was before them.

GRADUATION


