Dr. J. Dwight Pentecost was the speaker for the first Fall Conference in the history of L.B.I., held Oct. 20-24. Dr. Pentecost is assistant professor of N.T. Literature and Exegesis at Dallas Theological Seminary and is the author of the new classic volume on prophecy, "Things to Come."

Enthusiasm for Dr. Pentecost's clear teaching grew as informal discussions continued outside of the regular conference hours. His ministry encouraged us to live a holier life.

During the morning sessions, Dr. Pentecost traced through the Prophecy of Zechariah. To many of us, the book opened up before our eyes as it had never done before. The evening messages brought to life the power of the AntiChrist and the future role of Palestine, Rome and Russia. The present world situation made these subjects particularly absorbing.

Graduation

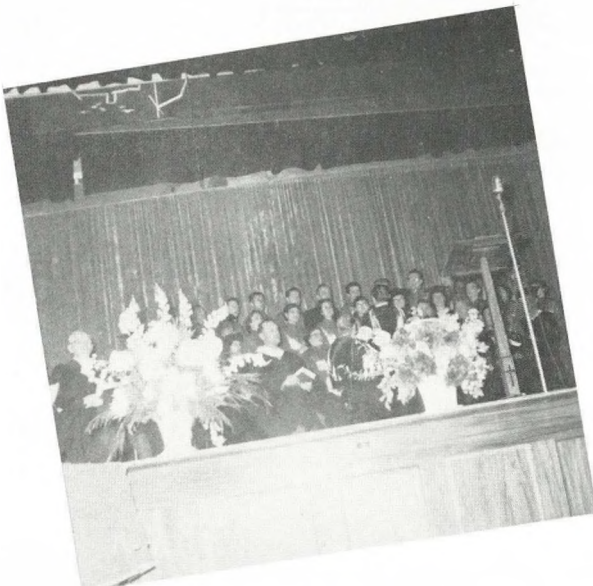

Next time you visit L.B.I. why not come with us on some Christian Service opportunities and see how the Lord uses them to prepare us for future service for Him.

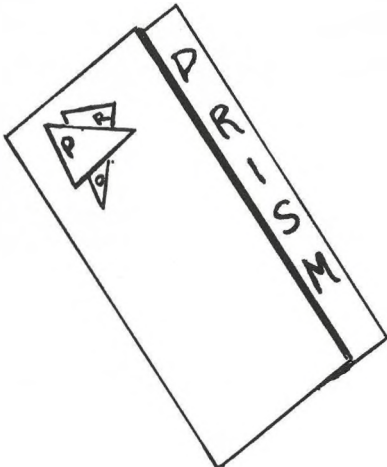

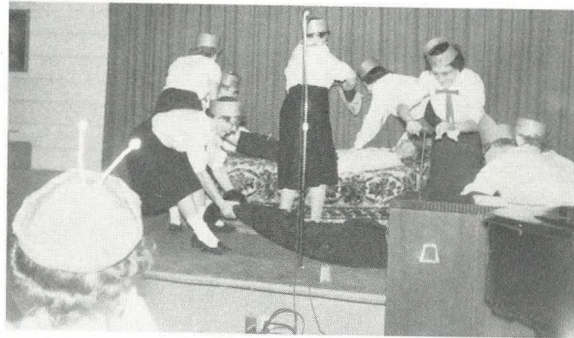
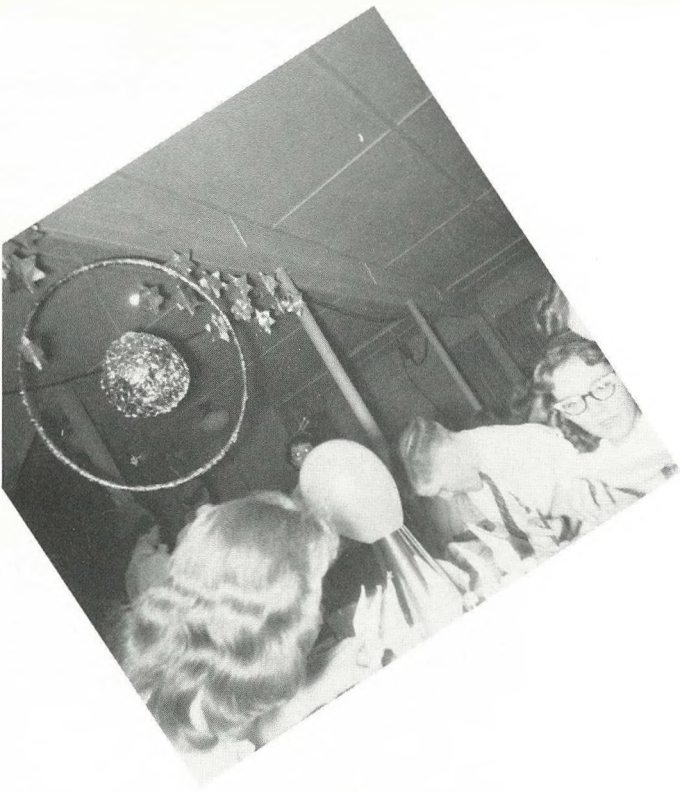

- To maintain sufficient organization and administration to adequately fulfill these purposes.

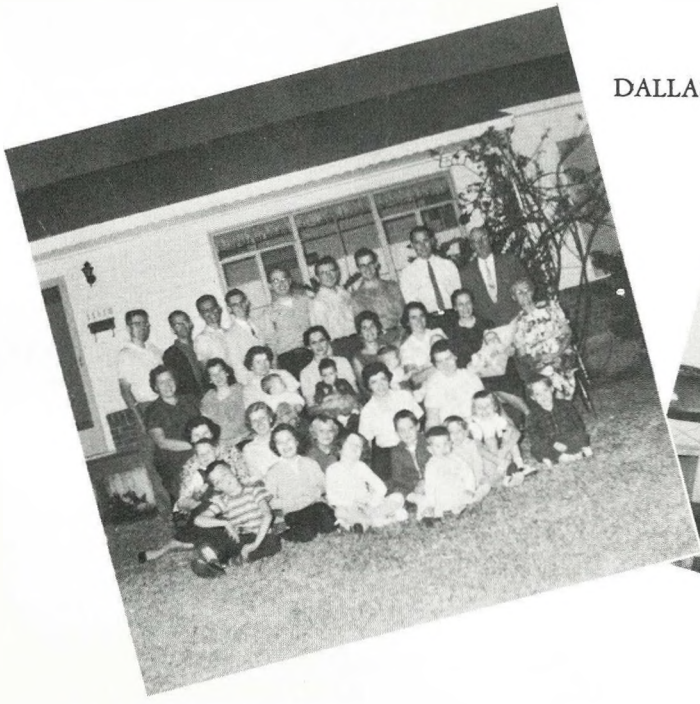
