FRANK ROWE

When Mr. Frank Rowe came to L.B.I. in 1956, he was 59 years old. Several years before, he had gone to an evangelical church service in Windsor. "I heard what my soul needed and had never had," he said. Some weeks later he accepted Christ.

In 1959 he graduated from the General Bible Course. He devoted much time to teaching boys in Sunday School and to counselling at Forest Cliff Camp.

His first seventeen years were spent in England. During World War I he was a military pilot. Later he lived in Spain and Portugal for seven years.

A mechanic and electrician by trade, he also served 20 years on a school board near Windsor.

Mr. Rowe had seven children. His wife predeceased him.

On October 10, 1960, following a brief illness, he passed into the presence of the One whom he had known and served only a short time. One who knew him said, "He did more in his few years of witnessing than many of us will do in a life-time."

Those of us who knew Jim Moyer as a friend and fellow student will always think of him when we sing,

"Trusting Jesus, that is all".

He was stricken with a spinal infection during the completion of his third year in the Pastor's Course. Jim's last words to Louise his wife were

"We will have to trust Him more."

Born in Kitchener, Ont., Jim received his early education there, completing grade thirteen at Kitchener-Waterloo Collegiate. At the age of eight he gave his heart to the Lord. Following high school, the Lord led him to London Bible Institute.

Through his prayers, interest and obedience to God, he began a church at Blair. He loved the people to whom he faithfully ministered the Word of God. On May 1, 1960, he was unable to preach the evening message. Suddenly on May 19 his illness advanced and he remained unconscious until passing away early Friday morning, May 27, 1960.

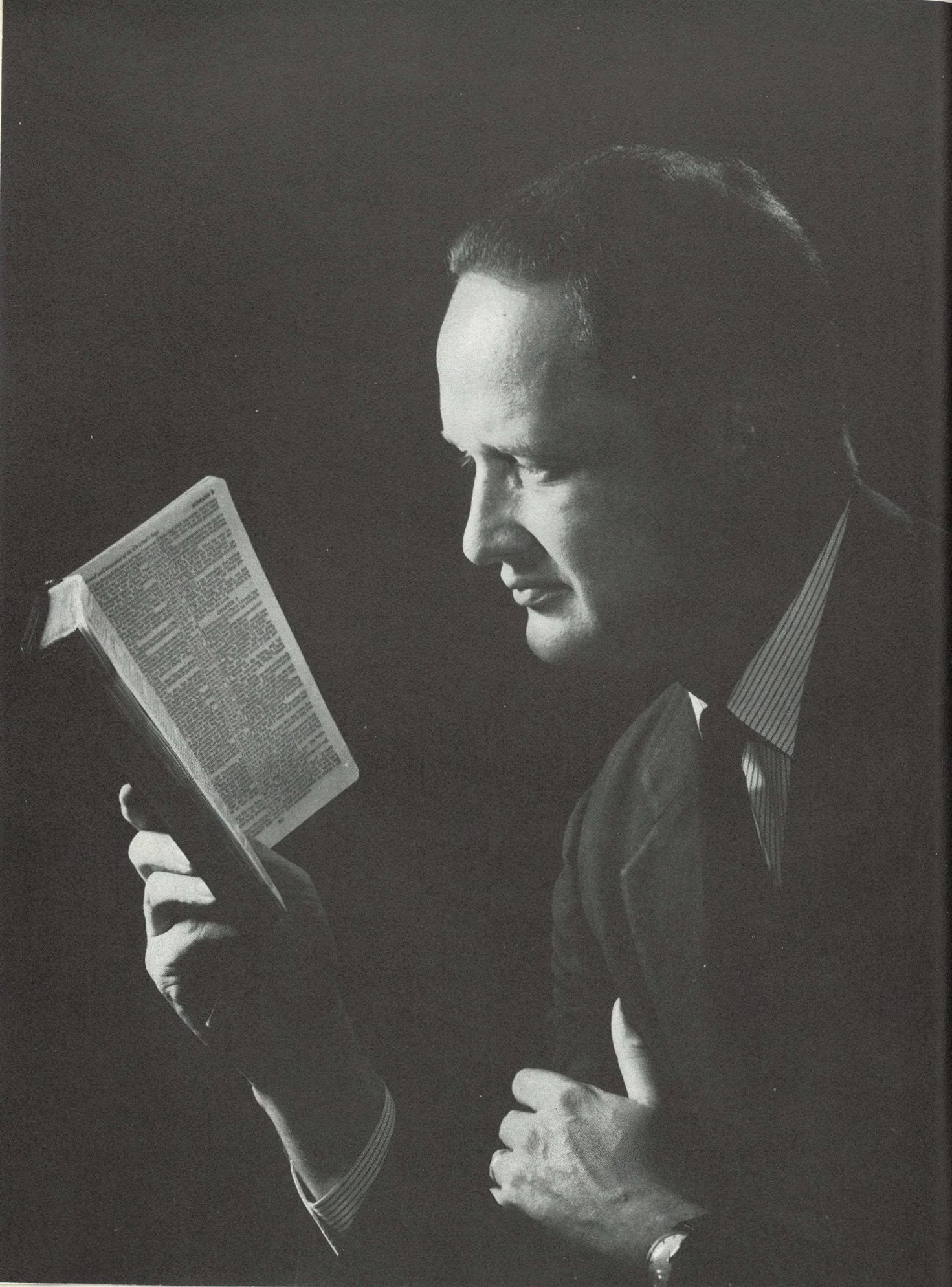
Ron Allison, who ministered to the Cree Indians of North America, went home to be with the Lord on February 12, 1960, following a prolonged illness. He was twenty-seven years old.


Born in Toronto, he was saved at the age of nine. He attended Scarborough Public School and Danforth Technical School. Before coming to L.B.I., he qualified for his Pilot's Wings.

A year after graduating from the Pastor's Course in 1954, he married Elsie Pranke. Together they studied Cree at Meadow Lake, Sask., while candidates for the Northern Canada Evangelical Mission. They worked at Fort Chipewyan, 500 miles north of Edmonton, Alta., and Island Lake, 350 miles north of Winnipeg.

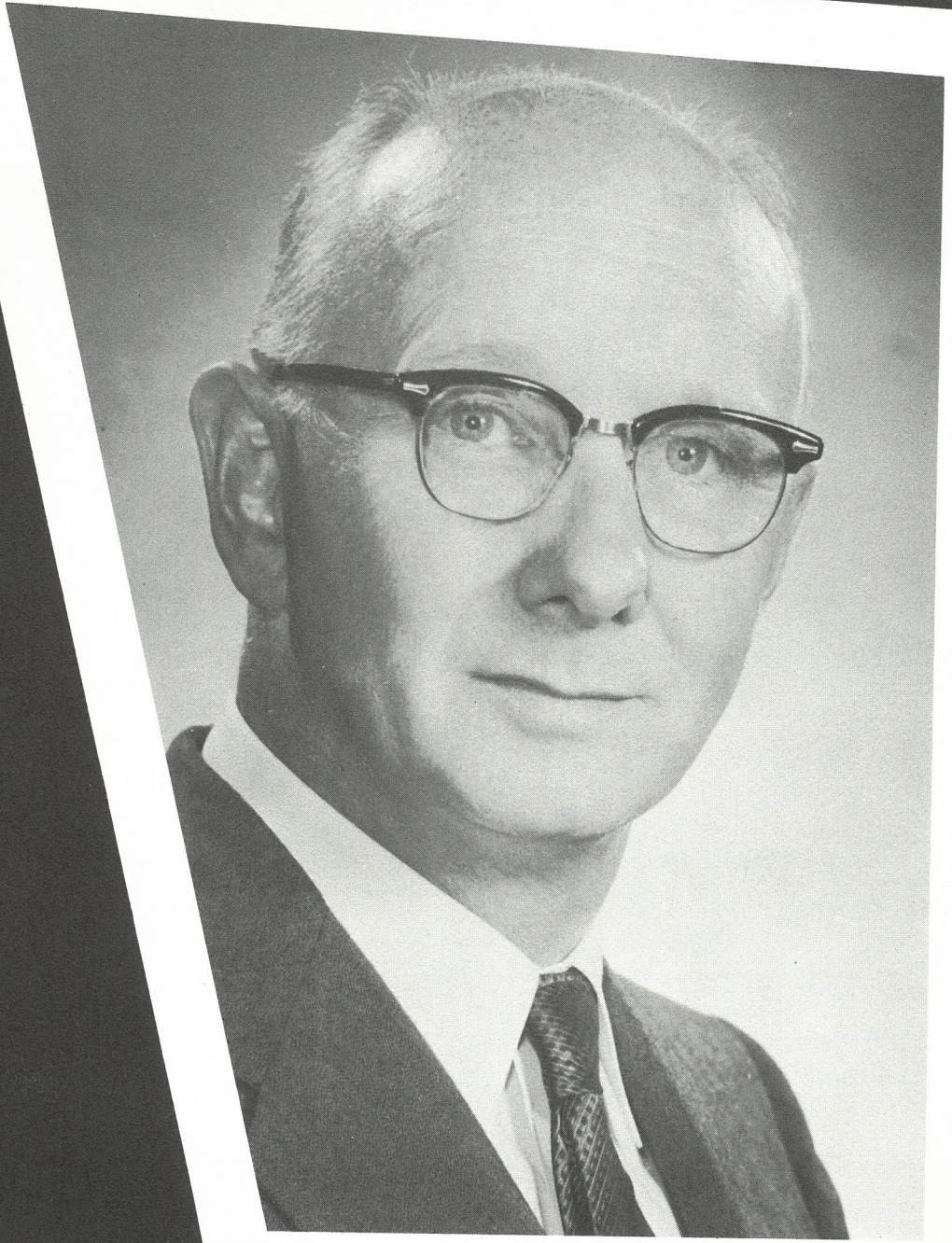
The Allison's son, Lyndon James, was born in 1956.

My prayer for all of you is that you may show yourselves men and women of God, workmen approved, true ambassadors of Christ.

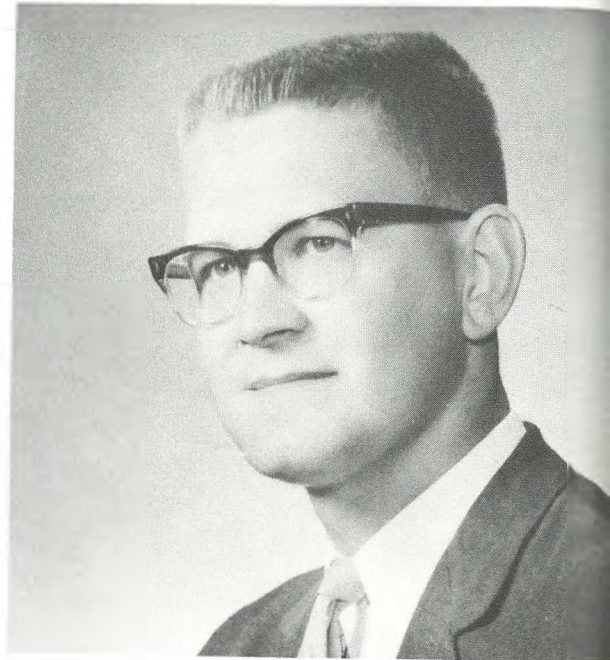

"To abide in the Lord means we must have an obedient love for Him," the speaker said.

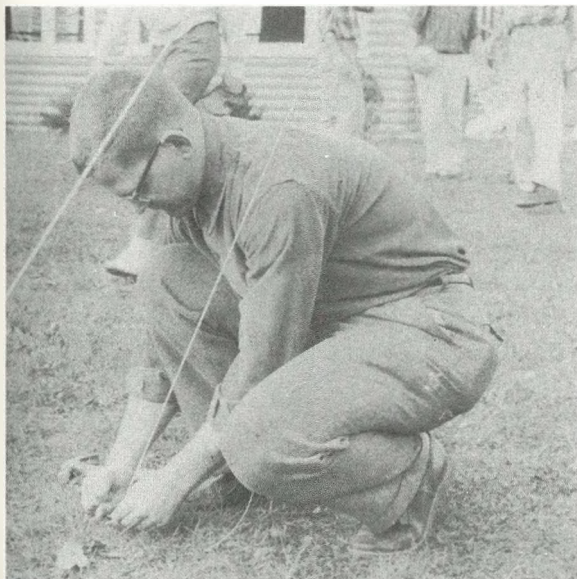
God blessed the fellowship together. All will remember for a long time the Saturday night testimonies, and outdoor worship service Sunday morning.

Last Year's S.M.F. Project

Last year's S.M.F. gave \$1000 to Ivor and Ruth Greenslade, (grads of '51) to build a new launch to aid in their work in Iquitos, Peru, with the Indians along the Amazon. Their letter of November 2 informed us of the progress being made.

"The launch is under construction down below us on the Amazon. We had to junk the old one as the hull was rotting. Two fellows from Iquitos just returned from installing the motor. The launch should be ready by the end of December."

"We won't be using it as our furlough comes up next year. The Porters from California will be taking over the launch to work amongst the Indian tribes below Iquitos. There is a great need amongst these Indians which the launch will help meet in a very real way."

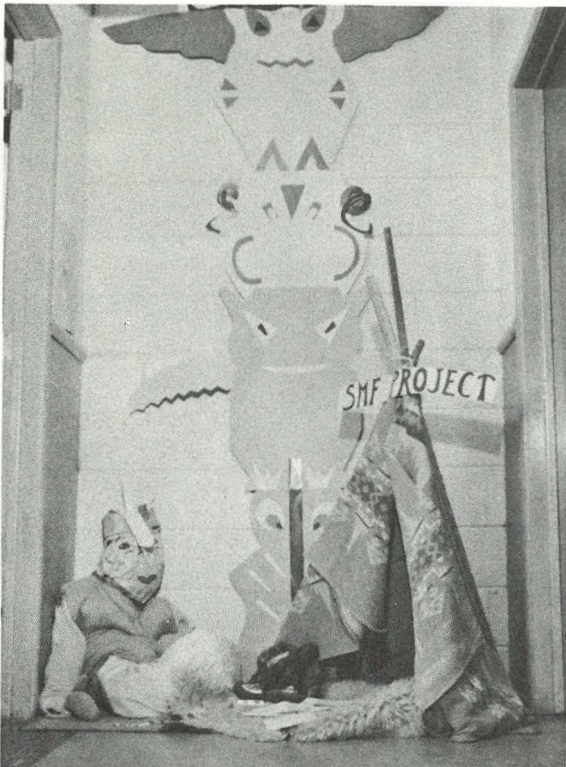
This Year's S.M.F. Project

A missionary family boarded a train at Cochrane, Ontario and travelled to the end of the line in September, 1958. Here in the settlement of Moosonee, the first effective evangelical mission station on the James Bay Coast, was established.

Today this station still stands alone as the only Gospel witness in that area. Yet James Bay is the focal point of the Moose Cree Indians. Along its hundreds of miles of coastline nestle many Cree settlements.

The \$1000 project of S.M.F. this year is establishing two new stations, Eastmain, and Paint Hills, under the Northern Canada Evangelical Mission.

Mid-Winter Conference Feb. 8-12, 1960

Dr. John C. Montgomery, Christian psychiatrist from Dallas, Texas, was guest speaker at the Mid-Winter Conference. In discussing normal behaviour patterns, he said, "Don't be a perfectionist or a defeatist."

The Scripture verse that characterizes the normal personality is 2 Tim. 1:7, he said. "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."

Dr. Montgomery spoke of the happy home as one that was established on a Christian foundation. "I have never seen a happy home where the woman is boss."

Students appreciated the opportunity of speaking to him personally.

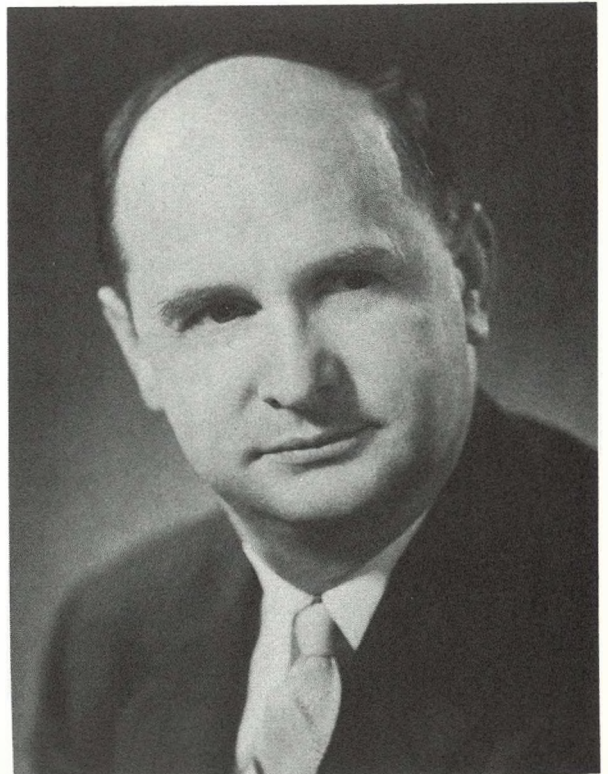
Spring Missionary Conference March 16-18, 1960

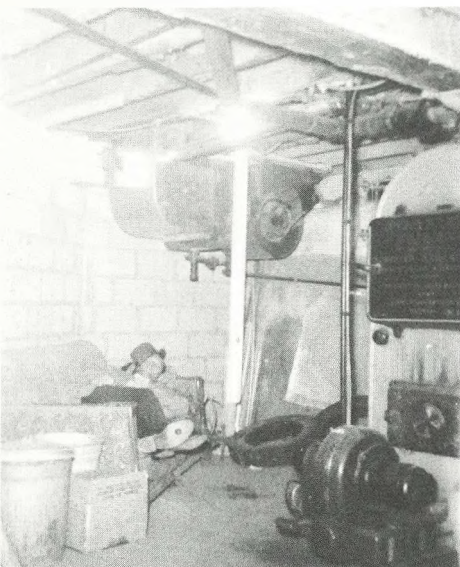

Mahood regarding plans for a Bible Institute in London, Dr. Mahood answered the call of God and came to London to found the London Bible Institute. For many years he had been a field representative of Moody Bible Institute and had retired to a California pastorate. He readily relinquished this at the age of 73 to do what he believed was a divinely designated task. Over 100 students registered for the bi-weekly night classes in the London Gospel Tabernacle.

1936 Day school was inaugurated and the evening work continued. The God-given objective of this Institute was to prepare young people as pastors, evangelists, missionaries, and consecrated Church helpers. The object was not merely to give a head knowledge but a heart training, leading to loyal, sympathetic and fully consecrated service.

1938 Registration was only \$7.50 per semester; books, \$2.00; room and board, \$6.00 per week; no tuition fee. The school moved to 517 Queens Avenue and became a chartered Institute. Both day and evening classes were held.

1944 At the age of 81, because of failing health, Dr. Mahood resigned after serving as President from 1935 to 1944. During the summer, under the auspices of Dean J. E. Hartill, an auditorium was completed on the third floor of the school at 517 Queens Avenue. It was named Mahood Hall in honour of the man who had the vision, courage, and persistence needed to establish L.B.I.

1945 Dr. James Bedford became President. During the summer, because of the increased enrollment of students, the school moved across the street to its new larger home at 518 Queens Avenue. The school expanded and set up departments in Missions, Theology, Christian Education, and Music.

1946 Day school enrollment was 170.

1947 A dedication service was held and the school building at 518 Queens Avenue was officially named Mahood Hall in honour of its beloved founder.

1949 Day school enrollment was 195, the highest on record! Registration was now \$35.00 per semester.

1951 The Theological Seminary Division was begun, offering the following degrees: B.Th., B.Th. Missionary Course, B.R.E. in Christian Education, B.D., and B.D. Missionary Course.

1952 The Hooper Memorial Chapel was dedicated to Dr. E. Ralph Hooper, whose five year ministry at L.B.I. was closed by his sudden home-going on June 17, 1950. Dr. Hooper was Dean of the Institute and Director of the Missionary Department.

1954 saw the close of Dr. James N. Bedford's Presidency at L.B.I. His term was 1945 to 1954.

1954-1957 Dr. Alden A. Gannett came in 1954 from Dallas, Texas, where he was a pastor and a teacher in the Dallas Theological Seminary. In 1957 he was led of God to return to this seminary, where he accepted the position of Professor of English Bible and Theology.

1955 The \$15,000 mortgage note was burned. The mortgage had been taken out to renovate the present dining hall and to double the accommodation of the girls' dorm to 65.

1956 saw the beginning of the college-level programme with Grade XII as minimum entrance pre-requisite for all courses.

1957 The ribbon was cut to open the Alloway residence for men.

1958-1959 Dr. Percy H. Harris, who in 1958 succeeded Dr. Gannett as President, was struck by polio and on November 2, 1959, entered into the house of God to dwell forever in the home prepared for him by Christ.

1960 Our new President, Dr. J. C. Macaulay, came to us this year from the Moody Bible Institute, where he taught Systematic and Pastoral Theology, Personal Evangelism and English Bible. As this quiet, humble servant of God assumes the responsibility of leading our school, we ask that you will join in prayer for him. May God grant that His rich blessing will be upon Dr. Macaulay as he ministers to our school family.

THE GRADUATES At present the number is 524, 72% of whom are in full-time service at home or abroad. The service rendered by these is a tribute to God's grace and the work of the founders of the school.

THE FACULTY are well prepared, spiritually and academically for this high calling of God. Their average length of training is seven years beyond high school.

THE BOARD School policies are established by the Board of Directors whose business ability and spiritual maturity are combined in a labour of love freely given for the Lord's sake.

THE ADMINISTRATION President Macaulay and Mr. Morrison combine their rich experience to lead our school. Dr. Macaulay spent 31 years as a pastor and nine years as an educator. Mr. Morrison spent 12 years as an Employee Relations Manager in charge of personnel-employee-labour relations.

THE STEWARDS It requires \$96,000 per year to maintain the financial needs of L.B.I. Only $\frac{1}{4}$ of this amount is derived from tuition fees. The burden of providing the remainder has rested upon the friends of the school, whose generosity has been greatly appreciated.

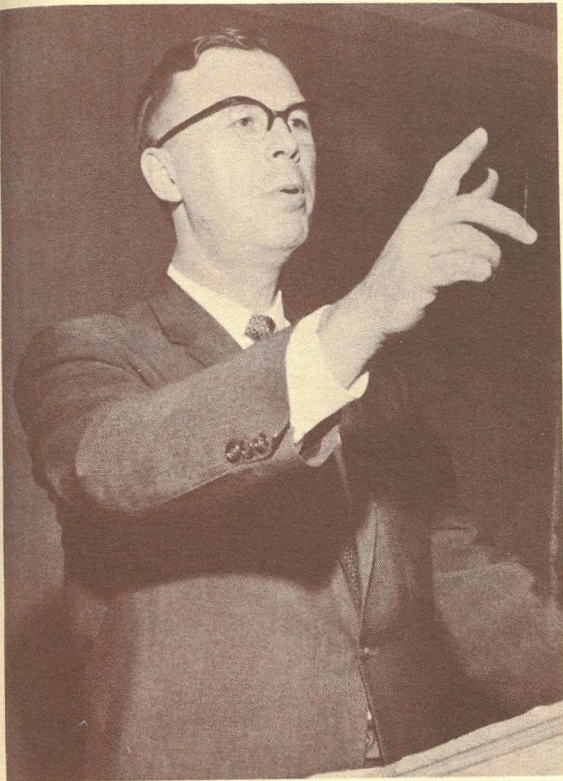

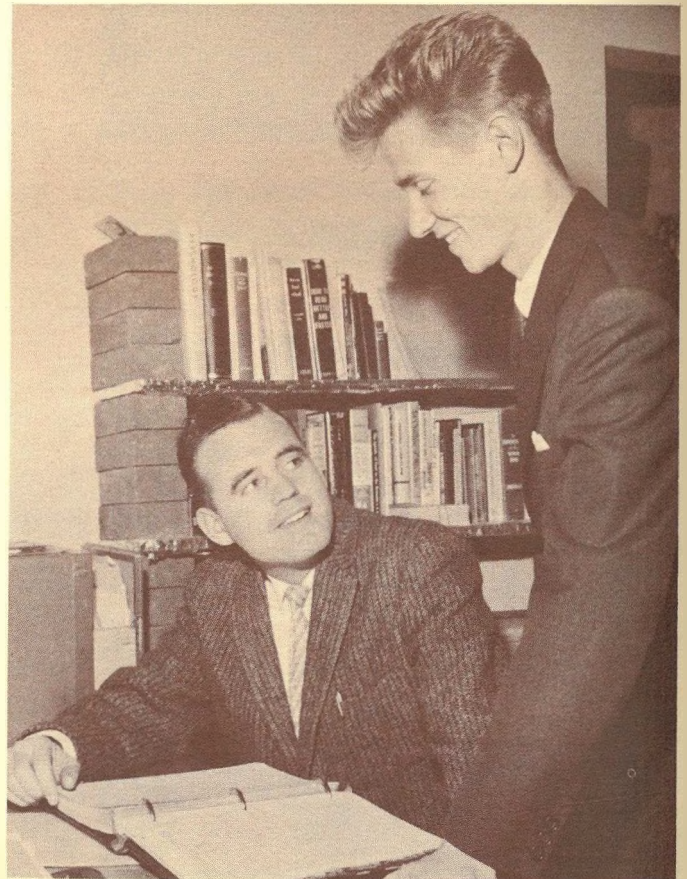

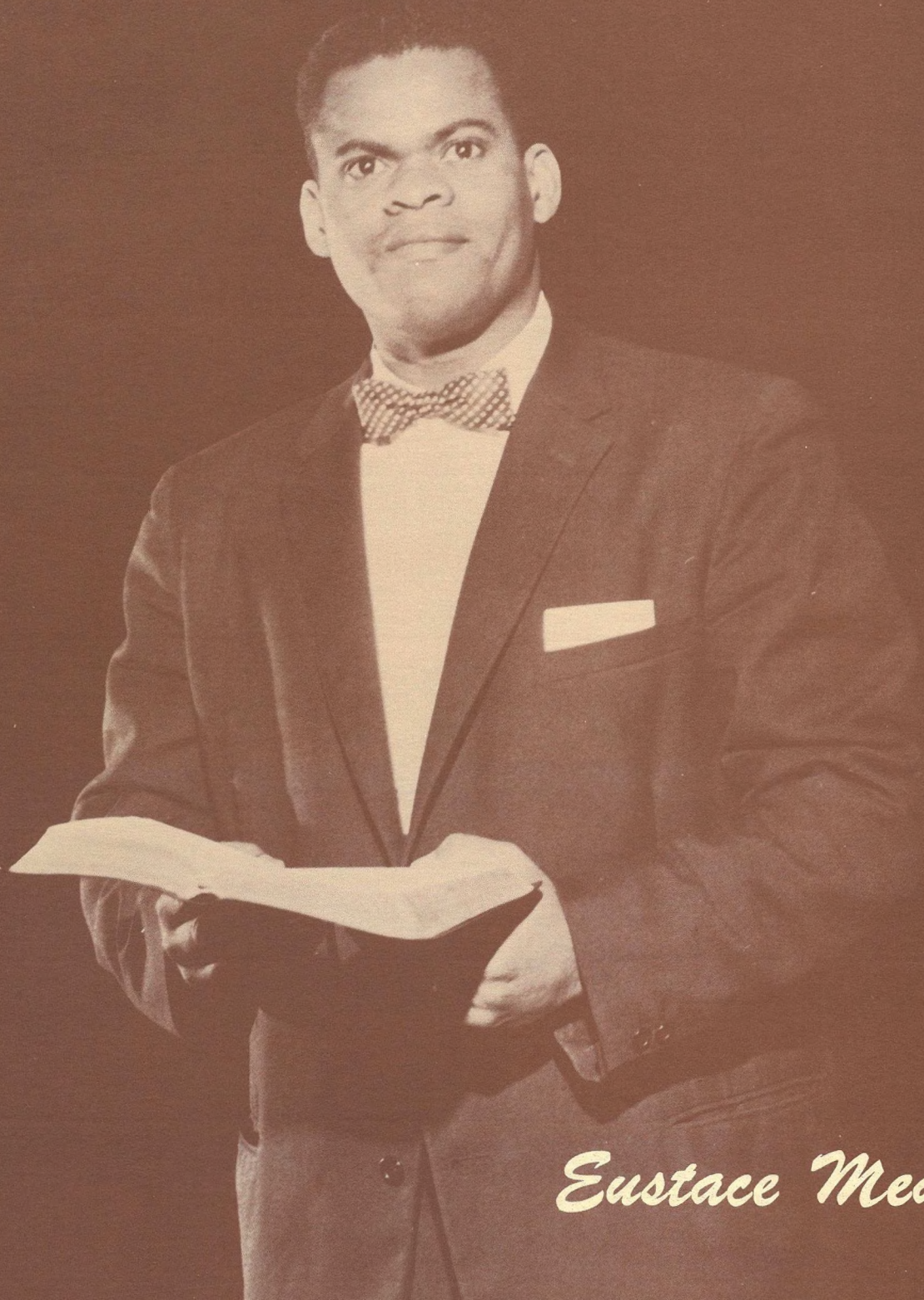

Speaking at the Baccalaureate Service in Central Baptist Church, May 8, Mr. Holiday shared his experiences in a near-fatal car collision seven months before.

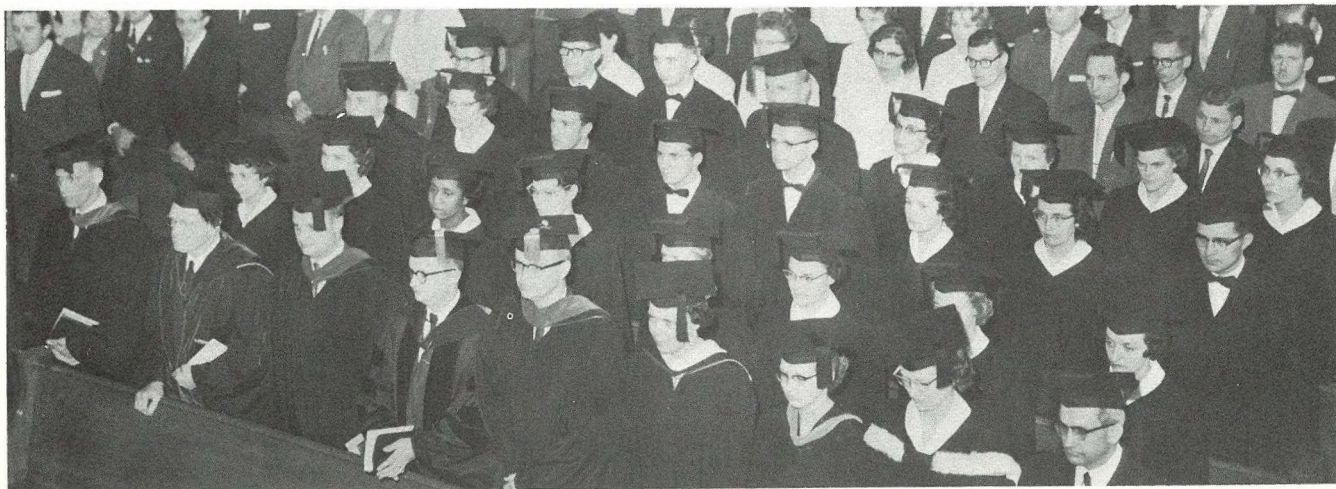
"The message I have for you today was given to me while I was recuperating," he said. "It is 'The Incompar-

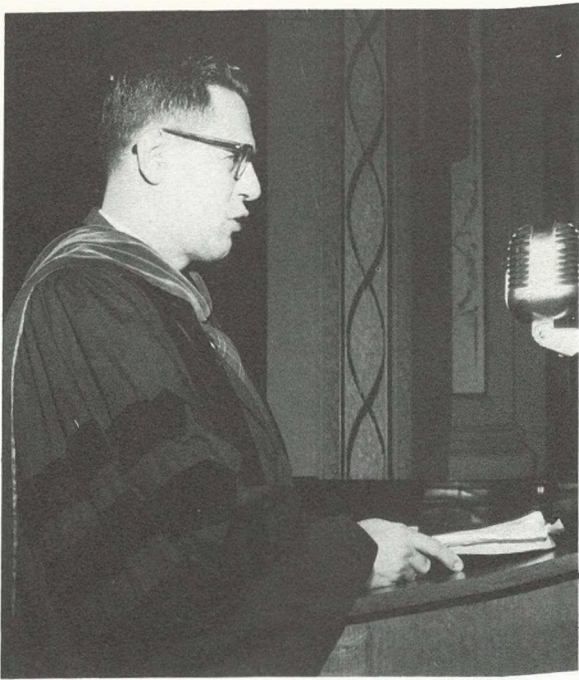

As faculty, graduates and students take their places, the Baccalaureate Service begins.





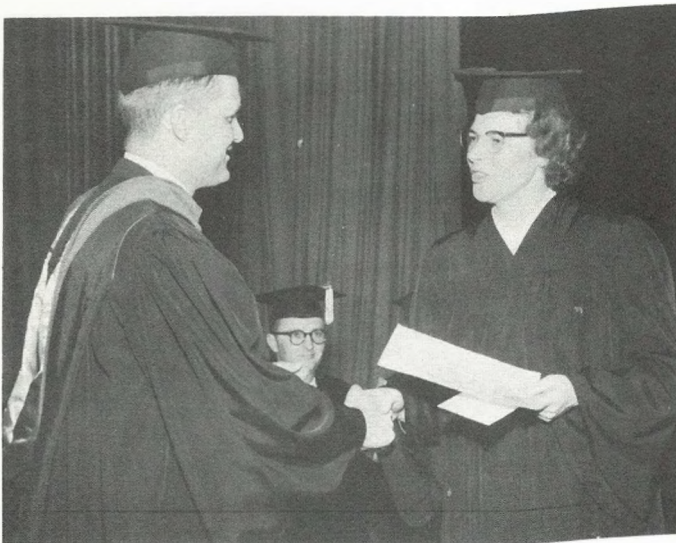

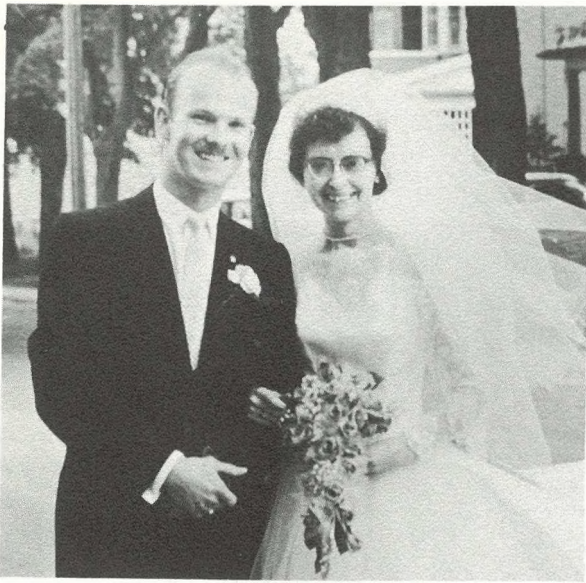
