





# In Memoriam

#### MISS RUBY WONNACOTT

My potter's busy wheel is where I see a desk and office chair, And well I know my Lord is there.

And all my work is for a King Who gives His potter songs to sing. Contented songs, through everything.

As Ruby carried out her duties in the business office at London College, she lived the words of this poem, which she kept by her typewriter. During the four months she was here we saw the results in her devoted service and fragrant life.

On July 14, 1961, after a month's illness with acute leukemia, the Lord chose to take her home to Himself. We have felt the loss keenly.

Born in Pambrun, Saskatchewan, in 1935, Ruby was the only child of Mr. and Mrs. Norman Wonnacott. As a young girl she moved to Toronto where she completed her early education. Upon finishing Business College, Ruby worked for Toronto Youth for Christ.

The desire to prepare herself further for the Lord's service led her to New Brunswick Bible Institute, from where she graduated in May, 1960. She was then employed as a secretary in Toronto for a short time. She came to London College with the conviction that God had placed her here and that she was "actually employed by Christ." (Col. 3:25, Phillips.)

Ruby's submissiveness to her Lord is revealed in a favourite poem of hers, which was read at her funeral:

Things just don't happen to us who love God To us who have taken our stand, What matter the lot, the course, or the price, Things just don't happen, they're planned.




We are grateful to Dr. Quinn for taking time from his busy practice to assist in the training of young people at London College.


#### REV. W. ELWYN DAVIES Hamilton, Ontario


In the next ten days, the choir presented twelve sacred concerts between London and Ottawa.



The aim of this boys' camp is to lead Africans to Christ and to encourage them to serve Him in spite of their heathen surroundings.



The Caveys are working among the five million people in the area of Sao Paulo. They have helped to develop a Bible Training School, a literature program and a youth camp.




#### FRED AND DOROTHY SIMMONDS, Both '51 South Africa



We appreciate your interest in us materially and spiritually. May the Lord bless you for your sacrificial generosity.









London College has a unique Christian Service programme. The emphasis is on church-centered activity. Thus, the student develops a realistic outlook on the Gospel ministry and loyalty to a local church.

Each freshman is interviewed by the Director of Christian Service (left) and assigned to one of the local churches. There, under the pastor's guidance, the student learns from the experience of others.

The first term is spent becoming acquainted with the church through observing its various activities. Soon the student is given responsibility such as assisting in a Sunday School class.





Students find ample opportunity to assist in the musical ministry of the church.

In addition to activities within the church, students gain experience in other evangelistic services.

Some students have the opportunity of conducting week-night services at the London Rescue Mission.





On Sunday afternoons students assist in Gospel services at the Ontario Mental Hospital.

Perhaps a senior student may be given responsibility in such organizations as Youth For Christ.



However, as the student becomes more involved in his church, his Christian Service activities center there.




Frequently the pastor assigns the student to assist in children's meetings such as Boys' Brigade or Pioneer Girls.

Many students are in charge of a Sunday School class or a Young People's group. A responsible student, after he has been integrated into the church programme, may receive opportunities to preach and to organize activities.



Degree Programmes (Grades XIII or Senior Matriculation required)\*

- A three-year course leading to a B.R.E. (Bachelor of Religious Education) with a major in General Bible or Christian Education.
- A four-year course leading to a B.R.E. (Honours) with double majors in Christian Education and Music, or Christian Education and Missions.
- A four-year course leading to a B.Th. (Bachelor of Theology) with a major in Pastoral Studies or Missions. Hebrew is required for a B.Th. (Honours).

\*If a student has completed only Grade XII, a year of Arts (equivalent to Grade XIII) is required.

Non-degree Programmes (Grade XII required)

- One-year course leading to a certificate in Bible.
- Three-year course leading to a diploma and allowing for many electives.

London College maintains that it is sound educationally to teach a combined programme of Arts and Theology. For example, the B.Th. Pastor's Course contains a strong theological programme interspersed with carefully chosen liberal arts subjects.

A degree programme prepares a student for an immediate ministry, or for further education. For instance, with the B.R.E. in Christian Education a student is equipped for a ministry in Christian Education or for graduate work. The B.R.E. in General Bible contains sufficient Bible and liberal arts for entrance to the B.D. programme in many seminaries. A B.Th. (Honours) graduate should be able to complete a B.A. in one school year and a summer school.

The double major courses meet certain practical needs in the Christian Church; that is (a) a combined ministry in Christian Education and Music. and (b) a combined role of teacher-missionary.

With these goals in mind London College attained accredited status with the Accrediting Association of Bible Colleges, which is recognized by the U. S. Department of Education, the American Council on Education and most State Departments of Education. Some Canadian Universities also allow substantial credit for liberal arts courses at London College.


#### Winter Conference Feb. 29 - Mar. 3, 1961

# Fall Conference Oct. 30-Nov. 3, 1961

"One thing that is better than working for the Lord, is the Lord working through you," said Rev. Francis Dixon, of England, speaker at our 1961 Fall Conference.
"What a man is on his knees before God is what he is."

Dr. Macaulay in introducing Mr. Dixon said, "The fact that Mr. Dixon is pastor of a church and founder of a correspondence course is significant, but incidental. "Les makes his presence felt by his depth of spirituality," says his Pastor, Rev. H. Butler of Briscoe Street Baptist Church.


Les is active in various church organizations. He leads Sky Teens, Young Peoples, and assists in the adult Bible Class.

During his first two years at school. Les worked at Woodeden Crippled Children's Centre. "I'he kids just loved him," said a co-worker. "It was more than just a job to him."


