
By the moral and mental endowment that man has received from his Creator, provision has been made for the development of specific gifts and interests.

As we expand our frontiers of knowledge and experience to meet the challenge of the world, let us join hands in positively presenting our Lord as the basis and hope of all peoples.





Our New Crest

The crest of London College of Bible and Missions was adopted by the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors on December 18, 1962,

Against a white field, the colours of the school, delphinium blue and gold, are artistically blended.





The upper left section of the shield carries the open Bible, with the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. The Bible is the basic textbook of our College. The Greek letters constitute one of the titles of Christ, the eternal Word.



The torch in the upper right section of the shield denotes learning. We believe that creation is "God's other book", and the pursuit of knowledge must be carried on in this field as well as in the field of revelation.



The cross upon the globe reminds us of our mission to proclaim the Gospel of Christ to the whole world.



Surmounting the shield is the crown. The crucified Christ is also the crowned Christ, and those who bear the cross after Him will be rewarded with the crown of life.



The motto, taken from Psalm 43:3, means "Send out thy light". Only in His light can we see light.

Students' Council



Located at the center of student life at London College is a group of the busiest students on campus, the Students' Council. This body which represents each major student organization, is the hub of student activity.

Students' Council exists to co-ordinate all student organization and activities, thus providing valuable experience in leadership training within a responsible governing body.

In September 1962, the student body realized the accomplishment of their mission project by the arrival of Webster Kasonso from Northern Rhodesia, for whom they provided passage money.






As soon as I arrived at school I entered a sphere of progressive friendliness, helpfulness, and consideration.


