






We hope that you will enjoy our presentation of this school as we deal with it under the headings of:




"A Centennial Christmas" was presented by the College Chorale this December.

ACADEMIC LECTURES

Rev. Roy B. Zuck, Th. D. Executive Director, Scripture Press Foundation



Dr. Roy B. Zuck, Executive Director of Scripture Press, Illinois, lectured in the field of Christian Education at the 1967 Academic Lecture series.

The session topics centered around the Conference theme: Theological Dynamics of Christian Education.

In his concluding lecture the vibrant speaker made a "prescription for healthy churches": "Educationally minded pastors, Biblical approach to laity, aggressive adult education, a new focus on families, a reduction of fevered activity, vibrant ministry of outreach as a result of a deepened burden for the lost".


An informative talk given by Gordon Watts, Director of Guidance Service, Guelph Secondary Schools, began the day.




On April 29 in First St. Andrews Church the College and its guests gathered to witness the commencement exercises.
