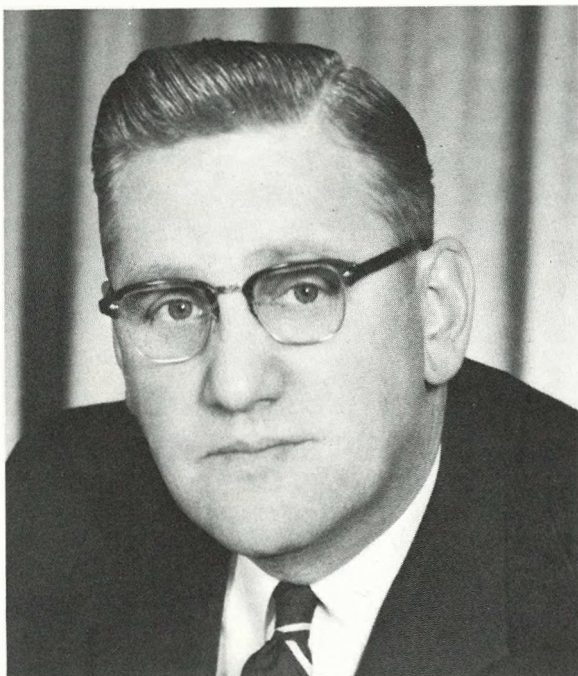
Dear Students:

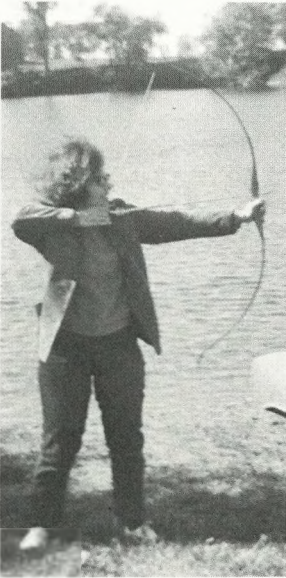
SENIOR RETREAT

When the cheering by our Centennial Cheerleaders and drum-beats died down, London College had won our fifth straight championship.

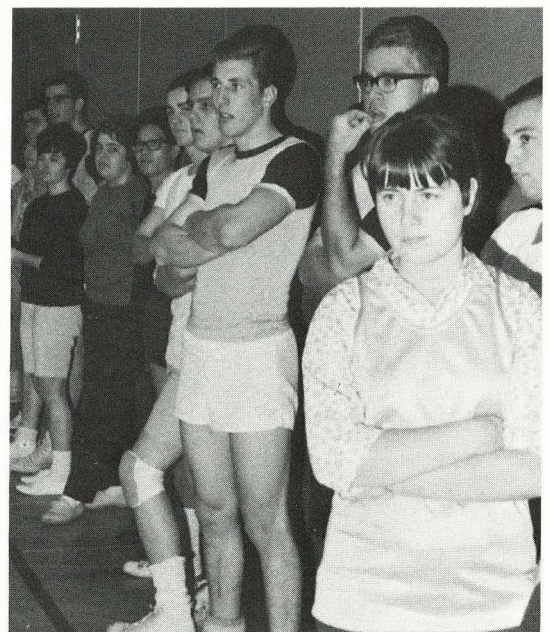

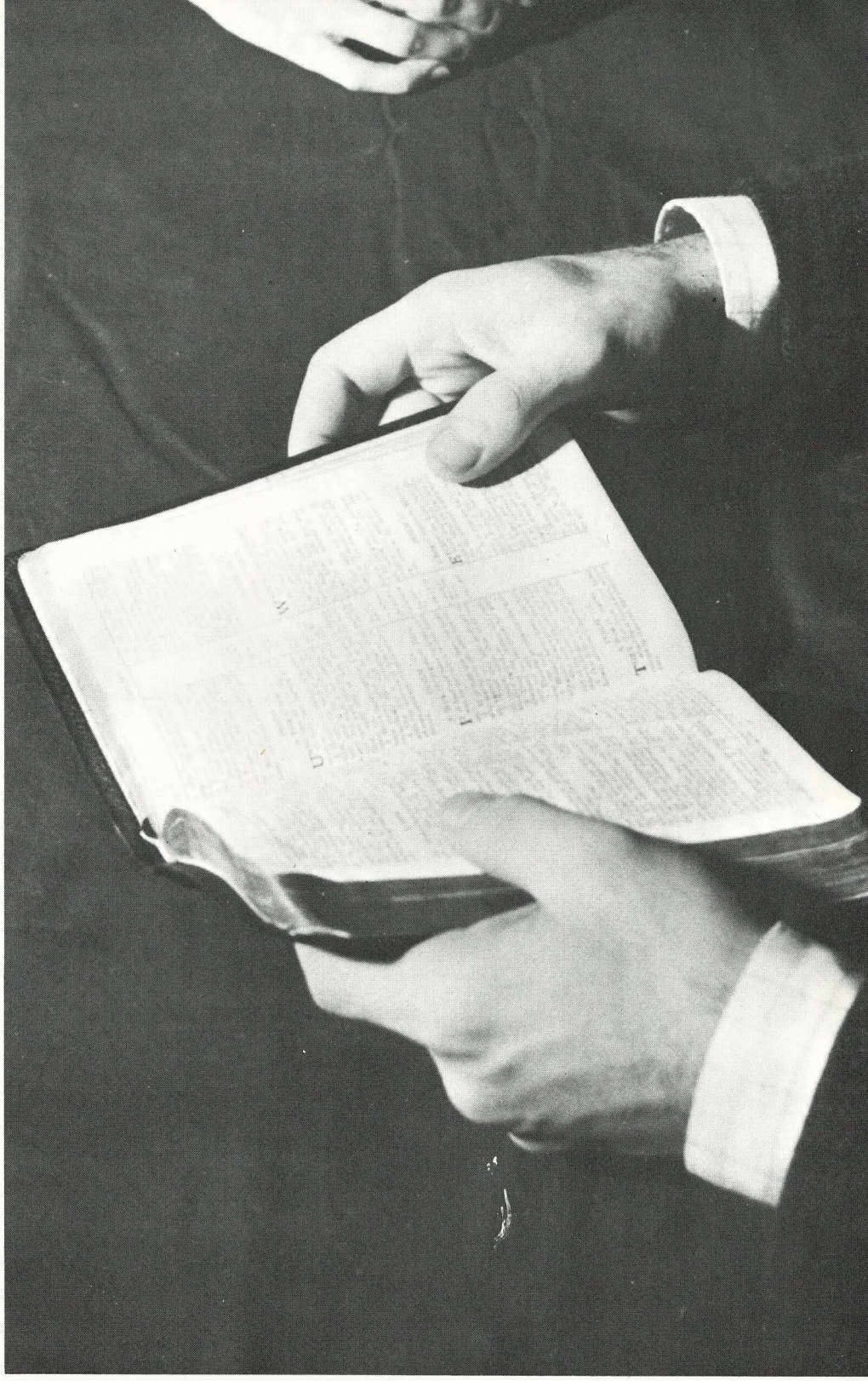


On April 29 in First St. Andrews Church the College and its guests gathered to witness the commencement exercises.

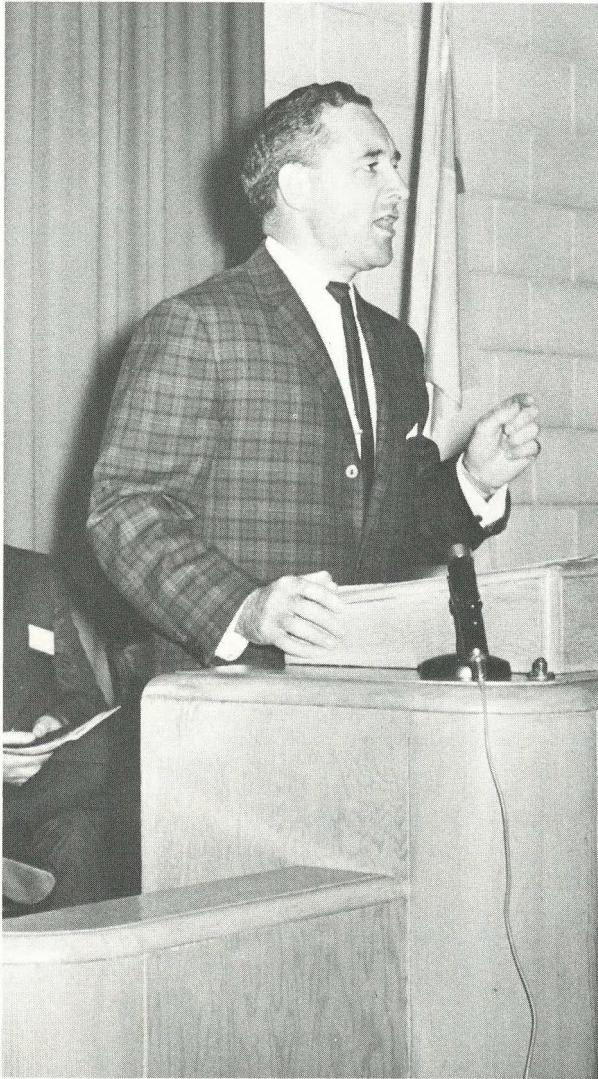

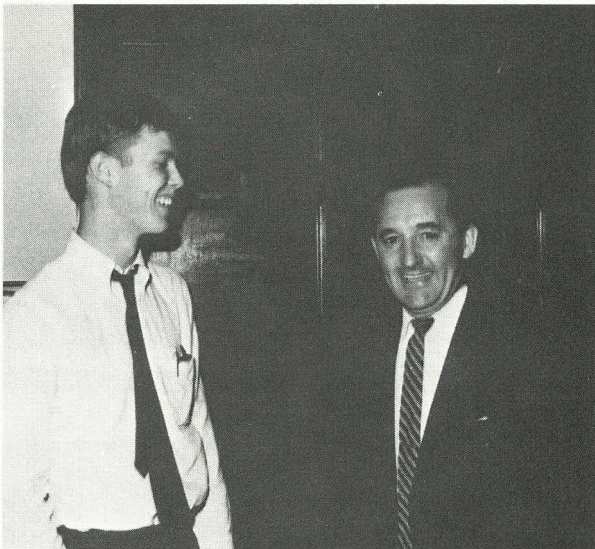
A Chapel Session

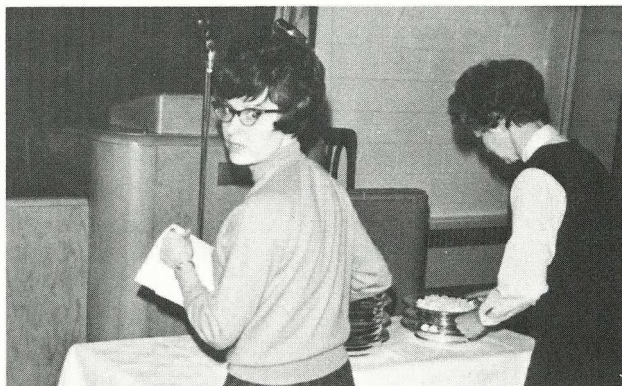
DAY OF PRAYER
